JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Larry Riney, Mayor; Curt Buerck, Tom Guth, Dennis House, Douglas K. Martin, Clint Rice, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Art Pistorio, City Attorney. Absent: Brent Buerck, City Administrator;

Mayor Riney opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

Mayor Riney now asks for citizens' participation from the floor.

Barbara Breig, of 907 Blackberry Lane, Perryville, informs the Board that she has placed sod on her property in an effort to alleviate her stormwater drainage issues. She relates that her neighbor is concerned about the temporary pipe that has been installed, noting that it appears to be broken and have holes. She is also concerned about the new homes that are being approved to be built because of the additional stormwater problems they will create, and she is concerned about drainage problems she may have after the temporary pipe is removed.

Mayor Riney tells Ms. Breig that someone from Public Works will check on the condition of the temporary pipe.

There being no one else coming forth, Mayor Riney closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

RESOLUTION authorizing the filing of an application with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, Financial Assistance Center's State ARPA Grant Programs for subaward of federal financial assistance provided to the State of Missouri by the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") pursuant to Section 602(b) of the Social Security Act, as added by Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act, (Pub. L. No. 117-2 (March 11, 2021), 135 Stat. 4, 223-26.

WHEREAS, under the terms of section 602(c) of the Act and Treasury's regulations, the State of Missouri has authorized the making of grants to authorized applicants to aid in the completion of specific public projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City of Perryville, Missouri, as follows:

1. That Larry Riney be and he is hereby authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the City of Perryville, Missouri, with the State of Missouri for grant funding to aid in the completion of: a lead service line inventory, or a drinking water, wastewater, and/or a stormwater project.

Description: Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements – This is a new wastewater treatment plant replacing the plant originally built in 1977. The plant will feature modern treatment technology and increase capacity.

2. That Larry Riney, Mayor, is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the Missouri Department of Natural Resources may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized, to sign all necessary documents on behalf of the applicant, to furnish such assurances to the Missouri Department of Natural Resources as may be required by law or regulation, and to receive payment on behalf of the applicant.

City Engineer Baer tells the Board of Aldermen that staff proposes to extend the Perryville Boulevard Sidewalk Project from Old St. Mary's Road to Highway 61. He tells the Board that they plan to request the extension from Edgemont to Robert Miget Park next year. He also notes that staff is working with MoDot regarding widening Star Street; however, that is not part of this project. After discussion and review, Alderman Buerck makes a motion stating the intent to commit funding relative to proposed MoDot grant application regarding the Perryville Boulevard Sidewalk Project. Motion is seconded by Alderman Rice, and on vote carried. Said Resolution is as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, STATING THE INTENT OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN TO COMMIT TO FUNDING, DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE PROPOSED PERRYVILLE BOULEVARD SIDEWALK PROJECT WHICH IS INCLUDED IN THE CITY'S GREENWAY TRAIL SYSTEM AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A GRANT APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF THE CITY TO THE MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

WHEREAS, the City of Perryville desires to make certain sidewalk improvements to Perryville Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Transportation offers competitive funding through the Transportation Alternatives (TAP) Grant Program to fund part of the proposed improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Perryville has agreed to commit the necessary financial resources required to qualify for the grant program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Perryville agrees to provide 36% of the project cost as match.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville agrees to commit to the proposed project's development, implementation, construction, maintenance, and financing in order to carry out the intent of the grant application.

Section 2. The officers, agents, and employees of the City of Perryville are hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents and take such necessary steps as they deem necessary and advisable in order to carry out and perform the purpose of this Resolution.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY AND **EMERY SAPP & SONS, INC.** RELATIVE TO **STATE BLOCK GRANT PROJECT 20-063A-2 REGARDING RECONSTRUCTION OF THE SOUTHEAST TAXIWAY AND EAST APRON TAXILANE: ADDITIVE ALTERNATE RECONSTRUCT SOUTHWEST TAXIWAY AT THE PERRYVILLE REGIONAL AIRPORT;** FURTHER SAID ORDINANCE SHALL AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE CITY CLERK TO ATTEST THE SIGNATURE OF THE MAYOR.

Alderman Rice presents motion, seconded by Alderman Schumer, and on vote carried Bill No. 6308, entering into Aviation Consultant Supplemental Agreement No. 2 for Construction Services with Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, is read for the first time by title only. The heading is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY AND **CRAWFORD, MURPHY & TILLY, INC.** RELATIVE TO **AVIATION PROJECT CONSULTANT SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 2 RE CONSTRUCTION SERVICES FOR REHABILITATION OF T-HANGAR APRON AT THE PERRYVILLE REGIONAL AIRPORT;** FURTHER SAID ORDINANCE SHALL AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE CITY CLERK TO ATTEST THE SIGNATURE OF THE MAYOR.

Mayor Riney asks for Committee Reports.

Alderman Guth, as Chairman of the Public Works Committee, ask Public Works Director Layton if any of the city's concrete streets or sidewalks have buckled due to the heat. PW Director Layton tells the Board that none of the City's streets or sidewalks have buckled; however, MoDot's sidewalk on North Kingshighway has buckled due to the heat. He also tells the Board that Public Works has begun spraying for mosquitoes.

Alderman Martin, as Chairman of the Economic Development Committee, asks Economic Development Director Jones to update the Board on economic development matters. Director Jones tells the Board that Downtown TIF grant applications are due on June 24th; there is a strategic planning session scheduled for August; and the EDA Board will meet on June 23rd.

City Engineer Report:

- **NE Sewer Project** – The construction of this project is now located on public works property and, because of the soupy ground, is moving slowly.
- **Technical Education Facility** – This project is making progress. Steel has not been erected yet; however, the concrete foundation is being poured.
- **Impound Building** – The roof is being installed.
- **Fire Station** – The groundbreaking ceremony for this project is scheduled for July 7th.

Mayor Riney asks the Board for any concerns, comments, or other non-action items they would like to present.

Alderman Rice tells the Board he was contacted by Ellen Westmoreland at 306 Newstead with a concern that her limbs hadn't been picked up for three weeks. She was told by a city worker that she wasn't

on the list. Public Works Director Layton reviews the limb pickup procedure and notes that residents should call if their limbs are not picked up in a week.

Alderman Rice also reports that he received a call that dogs were running loose on South Moulton Street. He wonders if there is a way to inform residents of the rules about allowing dogs to run at large.

Alderman Schumer asks Public Works Director Layton to send a truck to the corner of Big Springs Boulevard and Alma to pick up a tractor trailer tire next to stop sign.

Alderman Martin tells Public Works Director Layton that Mr. Roger Naeger would like to meet with public works regarding the sinkhole on his property.

Alderman Guth asks Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell to check on an overhanging tree limb at the Cindy Prost memorial bench in the park and to check on branches that are hanging over the trail. Alderman Rice also notes that TG has a problem with branches hanging over the trail as well.

There being no further business, it is upon motion by Alderman Buerck, second by Alderman Martin, and on vote carried, ordered that the Board now adjourn until Tuesday, July 5, 2022, at 6:30 p.m., the regular meeting in course.
