## September 6, 2022

# JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Larry Riney, Mayor; Curt Buerck, Tom Guth, Dennis House, Douglas K. Martin, Clint Rice, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Brent Buerck, City Administrator; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Art Pistorio, City Attorney.

Mayor Riney opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

Mayor Riney now asks for citizens' participation from the floor.

There being no one coming forth, Mayor Riney closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

At this time, Assistant Chief Bill Jones introduces newly hired Dispatcher Julie Grammer.

Mayor Riney now opens a public hearing regarding a rezoning request from RT Perryville, LLC, to rezone a portion of its property at 1105 North Perryville Boulevard from R-2 to C-2 for outside trailer/vehicle parking with future self-storage buildings.

City Administrator Buerck states that the Planning & Zoning Commission denied the rezoning request as originally submitted. After input from the neighbors present at their meeting, it was suggested the company instead file for a Special Use Permit which would allow for the same activities but use a different approval process.

There being no one else coming forward, Mayor Riney closes the public hearing for the rezoning request from RT Perryville, LLC, for its property at 1105 North Perryville Boulevard from R-2 to C-2 for outside trailer/vehicle parking with future self-storage buildings.

# **END OF CONSENT AGENDA**

At this time, Mayor Riney asks if anyone wishes to remove anything from the Consent Agenda.

Item 7 - Alderman Schumer makes a motion to postpone approval of the Capital Improvement Plan until the next meeting so that the aldermen have more time to study it and ask questions of staff. Alderman Rice seconds the motion, and on vote the motion carries. Alderman Guth comments on one of the projects listed on the CIP, noting that he was not in favor of that project. City Administrator Buerck notes that the CIP is a way for staff to inform the Board of projects they proposed to place on upcoming budgets and gives the Board a chance to discuss the CIP and remove or add items.

Item 9 – Alderman Rice asks for an explanation about this time. City Administrator Buerck explains that this is the process approved by the auditors for unexpected transfers.

Item 12 – Alderman Schumer asks when the city receives reimbursements for these items. City Administrator Buerck tells the Board that the City Treasurer submits reimbursement requests as the funds are needed. He notes that any amount over \$5 Million will be reimbursed by Ranken.

Alderman Schumer makes a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as amended. Alderman Rice seconds the motion, and on vote the motion carries.

At this time, the Board reviews options proposed for the Rock Quarry Lift Station project. City Administrator Buerck details that several years ago, staff brought their concerns to the Board of Aldermen regarding the age and condition of this lift station. He tells the Board that city engineers have worked with staff to propose three possible solutions, ranging in both scope and impact, all of which provide some level of relief.

City Engineer Baer explains how each option benefits the needs of the lift station. Option 1 would increase the flow capacity by approximately 50%, however, it utilizes the existing 40 year old steel dry pit which can only be accessed by a ladder and poses a safety concern for city personnel – Construction Cost estimated at \$800,000; Option 2 would install new concrete dry pit and pumps, increase the flow capacity by approximately 50%, eliminate safety concerns, and would set the system up for future expansions when/if necessary – Construction Cost estimated at \$1,500,000; Option 3 would install new concrete dry pits and pumps and replace the downstream force main and gravity system to trunk line, which would increase flow capacity for now and for many years to come, would also eliminate safety concerns – Construction Cost estimated at \$3,700,000.

After discussion and review, Alderman Buerck makes a motion to accept Option 2 proposed for the Rock Quarry Lift Station project. Alderman Martin seconds the motion, and on vote the motion carries.

Alderman Schumer makes a motion to approve the rezoning request from RT Perryville, LLC, for its property at 1105 North Perryville Boulevard from R-2 to C-2 for outside trailer/vehicle parking with future self-storage buildings. Alderman Martin seconds the motion. Roll call showed the aye and nay vote as follows: Curt Buerck, nay; Tom Guth, nay; Dennis House, nay; Douglas K. Martin, nay; Clint Rice, nay; David J. Schumer, nay. Totals: aye, none; nay, six. Motion fails.

City Administrator Buerck asks the Board to consider possible changes to the City's noise ordinance. He tells the Board that the City's Wastewater Treatment Project has caused some concerns from neighbors because the construction is beginning before the City's 7:00 a.m. noise curfew rules. He asks the Board if they would want to consider changing the time to 6:00 a.m. during the summer.

After discussion, it is agreed by the Board of Aldermen that the noise ordinance be adjusted to 6:00 a.m. during summer months with the addition of the ability to ask for a waiver from the City Administrator.

#### **RESOLUTION:**

She notes the upcoming activities planned Farm to Table. The continue to work on creating working to create a 501(c)(3) status for Downtown Perryville. They have submitted a grant application to the U.S. Commerce regarding funding for a transportation analysis, which appears to be moving along nicely.

Alderman Schumer, as Chairman of the Sidewalk Committee, encourages the Board to read the Transition Plan provided by SEMO Regional Planning Commission.

Alderman Guth, as alderman representative to the Park Board, asks for a status on the splash pad surface. Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell says the pad is doing well, noting that it has a 10 year warrant. He also notes that some of the concrete outside of the pad has some cracking, but the pad itself is good.

City Administrator Report:

• American Legion City of the Year - Next weekend, the Mayor and I will be attending the national convention for the American Legion and accepting the National City of the Year award on behalf of the Board of Aldermen and our community. This is an exciting event recognizing our community's great appreciation and respect for our veterans.

• **National Groundwater Protection Assn.** - That same week, I will be in Vermont presenting on our work relating to sinkholes and the grotto sculpin. This is the second significant such event this year and affords us an opportunity to share our story and introduce people to our community.

• **Thanksgiving Lunch** - The Cathcarts have had a heck of a run at this event and are looking for the next generations of volunteers to take it over. If you know someone who might be interested, please share this information with them as we hope to see the event continue well into the future.

• Violation Notification - Our most recent inspection at the airport concluded with a violation. We have been advised that we must purchase and install a Scully Overfill system to continue to sell fuel. We have worked to place the order and will soon correct this. We knew it would come eventually and here we are. This device is specific to planes and trucks that load fuel from the bottom.

• **Chester Bridge** - This was just to serve as an alert that the bridge was going to fully open over the holiday weekend in case the Board knew of anyone who needed to get equipment across the bridge itself. After that, it will return to a single lane as the repairs are finished.

• **City Budget 2022-23** - The Budget book has been posted online and staff has shared the link here.

• **City of Perryville Street Evaluation** - Tim, Jeff and I walked the lowest scoring asphalt streets. Our notes were used to develop the CIP and are shared here for the Board's information.

• **Perryville WW receives Journeyman Status -** Another weakness in the job market is finding and training qualified operations for water/wastewater departments. We are very proud to announce that one of our own, Nick Clifton, recently graduated from the MRWA Apprenticeship program.

• **BOTS Event – September 16-17** - Just FYI that this event is fast approaching, again coinciding with POW/MIA Recognition Day. This group recently separated from the DTR committee and EDA by forming their own 501(c)(3).

• **Fall Cleanup – October 17-21** - Twice a year, we provide a free bulk trash pickup for our customers. Anyone interested must call PW and schedule the pickup. Calls can be made any time after October 11<sup>th</sup>.

• Leaf Season – begins October 17 - We are already starting to see the occasional leaf drop and the official kickoff for leaf season will begin October 17<sup>th</sup>.

• Utility Billing Kiosk - All parts associated with our new kiosk have arrived, electric has been pulled and it will soon be installed by PW staff.

City Engineer Report:

• **NE Sewer Project** – The stormwater pipe on Ste. Augustine is complete. Crews should be crossing the creek this week. More tie-ins are expected next week.

• Lift Station Generator Project – The contractor has ordered the generator for this project (Welty and Show-Me Shell).

• **PPC Sidewalk Install for Elections –** Work has started on this project.

• **Apple Creek Boat Ramp** – City Administrator Buerck asks that City Engineer Baer revise his invoices for this project so that the city and the county are splitting the project 50/50.

Mayor Riney asks Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell for an update on parks and recreation activities. Director Cadwell tells the Board: soccer leagues and softball are in full swing; splash pad will close at the end of September; crews are ready to seed bare areas in the parks; the photo shoot in the playground was very successful.

Alderman Rice asks if staff would determine if winter swimming lessons could be offered. Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell notes that they have been offered in the past but were not well attended. He will check into the matter to see if it would be feasible.

Mayor Riney asks the Board for any concerns, comments, or other non-action items they would like to present.

Alderman House asks Public Works to check on the concrete street in front of Brian Dreyer's house on Sunset Drive, noting that the concrete is falling apart.

Alderman Buerck notes that a tractor has been parking in the 1200-1300 block of North Moulton Street and asks that the Code Enforcement Officer or Police Department keep an eye on this infraction.

Alderman Rice received a call from Rev. Handrick in Rambling Hills Subdivision with concerns about vegetation creeping onto the dead end streets. City Administrator Buerck tells the Board that staff will review the concern.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners submitted their Commissioners' Report adjusting the assessment of the value of the benefits to the property interests in the Bois Brule Levee District; and

WHERAS, the City of Perryville, Missouri, has property interests in the Bois Brule Levee District and filed exceptions to the newly adjusted value of the benefits to those property interests; and

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
