JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Larry Riney, Mayor; Curt Buerck, Tom Guth, Dennis House, Douglas K. Martin, Clint Rice, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Brent Buerck, City Administrator; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Art Pistorio, City Attorney.

Mayor Riney welcomes Boy Scout Troop 155 and opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

Mayor Riney now asks for citizens' participation from the floor.

There being no one coming forth, Mayor Riney closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

At this time, Mayor Riney opens a public hearing for a special use permit request from RT Perryville, LLC, for outside trailer/vehicle parking at 1105 North Perryville Boulevard.

City Administrator Buerck reminds the Board that Mr. Rob DuBroc drove from Kansas City to attend the October 4th Board of Alderman meeting because he thought the public hearing was set for that date, and the Board allowed Mr. DuBroc to speak during the Citizens' Participation portion of the meeting on that date. At that meeting, Mr. DuBroc told the Board that his original plan was to rezone the area, but the Planning & Zoning Commission, after input from the neighborhood, denied that request and suggested that he seek a special use permit instead. He told the Board that he plans to rent space to campers, boats, etc., to park on this lot, and, because it is a special use permit rather than rezoning, he will not build structures on the property. He also told the Board that he plans to fence the area, but will install an additional gate for a neighbor who has an easement across the property.

There being no one else coming forth, Mayor Riney closes the public hearing for a special use permit request from RT Perryville, LLC, for outside trailer/vehicle parking at 1105 North Perryville Boulevard.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE PROPOSED REZONING FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR CERTAIN PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A; SETTING FORTH THE AREA FOR SPECIAL USE AND THE CONDITIONS OF SPECIAL USE; ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, the City Board and the Planning and Zoning Commission have considered a proposed rezoning and/or special use permit for property described as 1105 North Perryville Boulevard, as set out in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on said rezoning and/or special use permit in accordance with the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, a special use permit to allow a parking lot for vehicle parking on said property in an R-2 Single-Family Residential District may be granted by virtue of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, after duly considering the recommendations of the City Planning and Zoning Commission and other input received at the required public hearing, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, has decided it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Perryville, Missouri, to grant a special use for said property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That an application for a special use permit, which said application is marked Exhibit A and attached hereto, is hereby approved, and a special use permit is hereby issued to Rob DuBroc and Kelly Kaiser, d/b/a RT Perryville, LLC, Applicant.

Section 2. That the property set forth in Exhibit A is hereby granted a special use permit to install a parking lot for vehicle parking on said property in an R-2 Single-Family Residential District.

The aforesaid special use permit is subject to the following specific conditions: compliance with all ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri.

Section 3. That the City Clerk of the City of Perryville, Missouri, shall and is hereby directed to indicate on the "Official Zoning District Map" of the City of Perryville, Missouri, the above special use permit and the date of issuance thereof and to certify same and to keep said map on file in the office of the City Clerk and a copy displayed in City Hall, City of Perryville, Missouri; and that said City Clerk is further directed to indicate on said "Official Zoning District Map" the existence of special conditions on the use of the aforesaid property.

Section 4. Violation of the special conditions listed above shall result in revocation of the special use permit and/or prosecution and/or fine under the zoning ordinances.

Section 5. This special use permit is issued to the applicant. If the holder of the special use permit transfers the real estate, the special use permit shall remain with the real estate. However, if the special use is discontinued for more than sixty (60) days or the new owner of the real estate uses the real estate for an activity not authorized by the special use permit, then the special use permit shall be void and the owner of the real estate must apply for a new special use permit.

Section 6. If construction is required for the special use granted hereunder, this special use permit shall expire in the event construction does not commence within six (6) months of the date of issuance of this special use permit and is not completed within two (2) years of the issuance of this permit.

Section 7. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval. approval.

- County-Wide Economic Development Strategy Plan This Board is in Perryville at this time and has been touring the area and meeting with the real estate companies, the Chamber, Downtown committees, etc. This is at no charge to the City.
- Housing Development The housing reimbursement program luncheon is scheduled for October 21st at the Catalyst Center.
- Ranken SE Meeting Local education and industry partners will be meeting with Ranken SE on November 8th.

City Administrator Report:

• Buchheit Announcement re Orscheln Farm Home Company - Last week we learned of exciting news that Buchheit Inc. has added 12 former Orscheln locations, increasing their footprint into three additional states.

- Next Youth Sports Arms Race This was an interesting article that details the benefits and financial impacts youth sport tournaments and events can have on a community.
- Missouri Veterans Hall of Fame Class of 2022 Perryville native Curt Vogel We were excited to learn that Perryville native Curt Vogel will soon join MNVM Founder Jim Eddleman at the Missouri Veterans Hall of Fame. This event is open to the public and is scheduled for October 28th at 2pm. It will take place in the Missouri Capitol Rotunda.
- Ransomware Attacks on State, Local Government One only has to watch the news to see the impacts of cyber security lapses on local governments, including cities, hospitals, and school districts. Staff is well into our conversation with Forward Slash on additional enhancements that will soon be required by insurance companies in order to get cyber security insurance including multi-factor authentication.
- Courthouse Lawn Master Plan This has been previously shared with the Board, but staff wanted to provide a reminder that the survey is currently open and available for public comment by scanning the QR code attached.

Jim Cadwell and staff were happy to help provide a venue for the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing Band here in Perryville on Sunday evening. By all accounts, the event was well attended and the band's performance was outstanding. While in town, the band was hosted for dinner at MNVM.
- National Disability Employment Awareness Presentation to PPC Oct 18 @ 10:30am The Perry Park Center was recognized today by County Disability Resources for their efforts to employ folks of varying abilities. We are proud of Jim and his staff and continue to look for opportunities to support those with different abilities.
- **Mosquito Season -** Staff uses various tools to monitor mosquito activity here in Perryville and generally will cease spraying after multiple nights with temperatures below 50 degrees. As late as last week, we were still getting phone calls from concerned citizens regarding mosquitoes, so I wanted to let the Board know when this service will discontinue for this season.

Public Works Director Layton notes that due to the lack of moisture, Public Works has stopped spraying for mosquitos.

• City Presentation to MoDot Commission – Nov 2 - On November 2^{nd,} the Missouri Highway Commission will be in Cape Girardeau for its quarterly meeting. We have requested an opportunity to speak to the Commission and thank them for their support of Perryville and Perry County over the last several years for projects ranging from Route AC to the Perryville Regional Airport, to the turning lane on Highway 51, and the Chester Bridge. Additionally, we will update them on the airport's charging station and formally invite the Commission to schedule a meeting in Perryville.

City Engineer Report:

- **NE Sewer Project –** Hydro-seeding and strawing has begun on this project. Asphalt will be laid on Ste. Augustine Street next week, which should be the completion of this project.
- Phase 3 of NE Sewer Project We are working to get this portion of the NE Sewer Project ready for bid this fall.

City Administrator Buerck notes that additional easements will be acquired for Phase 3 which will address more stormwater issues.

- **MoDot Trail –** Once the notice to proceed has been received from MoDot, we will begin this project. Current delay is due to MoDot's fiscal year period.
- **UV at Airport WWTP** It is expected to take 8-10 weeks to receive the equipment for this project. In the meantime, concrete and piping work will begin.
 - North Moulton Street Construction This project is expected to begin in the next 2-3 weeks.

Mayor Riney asks the Board for any concerns, comments, or other non-action items they would like to present.

Alderman House tells the Board that he has been contacted by Mr. Donald Pecaut regarding the sod placed at his house on North Parkview. Public Works Director Layton informs the Board that he met Mr. Pecaut at his residence along with Brad Kueker (owner of Kueker Landscaping) and it was determined that the dead spots were due to lack of water. Mr. Kueker says the sod does not have a disease and should be okay next Spring.

City Administrator Buerck notes that the City will only purchase sod one time per residence.

Alderman Guth asks about the price of winter natural gas. City Administrator Buerck informs the Board that more taxes are being placed on natural gas, and these taxes are being passed on to the city; however, winter gas will cost the City of Perryville less than summer gas because we have locked in much of our gas rates.

Alderman Guth notes that the flag at the Craig Lindsley roundabout is missing. City Administrator Buerck will contact Parks & Recreation about replacing the flag.

Alderman Martin asks for a report on the status of sinkhole repairs. Public Works Director reports that work is currently being done on Moore Drive, then will move to Oak Street, and then to the Naeger residence.

Now, at this time, upon motion by Alderman Buerck, seconded by Alderman Martin, it is ordered that the Board now convene into closed session to discuss contractual matter in accordance with Section 610.021(9) RSMo. Roll call showed the aye and nay votes as follows: Curt Buerck, aye; Tom Guth, aye; Dennis House, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Clint Rice, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, six; nay, none.

Following discussion and review, it is upon motion by Alderman Martin, seconded by Alderman Rice, that the Board now reconvenes into regular session for any business that might come forth. Roll call showed the aye and nay votes as follows: Curt Buerck, aye; Tom Guth, aye; Dennis House, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Clinton Rice, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, six; nay, none.

Mayor Riney asks if any letters have been received regarding the sidewalks on North Mouton Street. City Administrator Buerck reports that the only letter received to date was from Jonathan Paulus. It is expected that Caleb Clifton may submit a letter.

Alderman Schumer tells the Board that he will be having rotator cuff surgery on Friday, October 21.

There being no further business, it is upon motion by Alderman Guth, second by Alderman Martin, and on vote carried, ordered that the Board now adjourn until Tuesday, November 1, 2022, at 6:30 p.m., the regular meeting in course.
