Re: Police/Fire Radio System Upgrade



Issue:

St. Francois County 9-1-1 Dispatch is looking to upgrade their system to improve coverage and bring the system in line with new technologies. The backbone of the system needs to be brought up to date and there are no grant funds available for the improvement. There are funds available for mobiles and portables and we've been utilizing those funds when we buy new radios.

Cost for the towers/transmitters/sites will be 3.1 to 3.2 million dollars. Our cost not included in the \$3.2m for police/fire radio improvements is estimated at \$830,000 but the fire and police departments have been updating radio equipment to the new specs when purchasing so the cost for our equipment will be less.

Ste. Genevieve County (which includes the City) will have to help fund the backbone part of the improvements along with our own improvements. The issue will be how to pay for those improvements. 9-1-1 taxes are down because cell phones are not taxed like landlines. If we were to change to taxing cell phones or any device with a data plan (not wifi) it is a flat rate of \$1 (up to \$1.50 if recommended by the state 9-1-1 committee) and that would have to be a ballot issue.

Is the Board of Alderpersons willing to support and place that tax question on the ballot? County Government has been discussing and believe that the cell plan charge is the fairest way to help pay for a robust 9-1-1 system that residents need in the time of an emergency.

Recommendation:

Consider the question and we will continue working with Ste. Gen. County at their invite how best to move forward.

Re: Recreational Marijuana



Issue:

David Bova, as the Community Development Administrator, has been following Proposition 3 on the ballot because of zoning changes that would need to be approved if the Constitutional Amendment passes. So this whole item may be most after the November 8 election.

There will be different regulations that will need to be adopted that do not duplicate the medical marijuana zoning and legal issues that were adopted. One of the allowances in this amendment is allowing cities to add a 3% tax to marijuana sales.

There may be legal challenges but we need to be prepared for adoption to remain in compliance with state statute and one of the first deadlines for the state is 90 days after voter approval.

Recommendation:

A quick outline of some changes to the zoning code if the amendment passes and discussion of next steps.
