6. Verification of DBE Participation: Prior to final payment by the Local Agency, the Engineer shall file a list with the Local Agency showing the DBEs used and the services performed. The list shall show the actual dollar amount paid to each DBE that is applicable to the percentage participation established in this Agreement. Failure on the part of the Engineer to achieve the DBE participation specified in this Agreement may result in sanctions being imposed on the Commission for noncompliance with 49 C.F.R. Part 26 and/or Section 1101(b) of TEA-21. If the total DBE participation is less than the goal amount stated by the MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division, liquidated damages may be assessed to the Engineer.

Therefore, in order to liquidate such damages, the monetary difference between the amount of the DBE goal dollar amount and the amount actually paid to the DBEs for performing a commercially useful function will be deducted from the Engineer's payments as liquidated damages. If this Agreement is awarded with less than the goal amount stated above by MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division, that lesser amount shall become the goal amount and shall be used to determine liquidated damages. No such deduction will be made when, for reasons beyond the control of the Engineer, the DBE goal amount is not met.

- 7. Documentation of Good Faith Efforts to Meet the DBE Goal: The Agreement goal is established by MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division. The Engineer must document the good faith efforts it made to achieve that DBE goal, if the agreed percentage specified is less than the percentage stated. The Good Faith Efforts documentation shall illustrate reasonable efforts to obtain DBE Participation. Good faith efforts to meet this DBE goal amount may include such items as, but are not limited to, the following:
- A. Attended a meeting scheduled by the Department to inform DBEs of contracting or consulting opportunities.
- B. Advertised in general circulation trade association and socially and economically disadvantaged business directed media concerning DBE subcontracting opportunities.
- C. Provided written notices to a reasonable number of specific DBEs that their interest in a subconsultant agreement is solicited in sufficient time to allow the DBEs to participate effectively.
- D. Followed up on initial solicitations of interest by contacting DBEs to determine with certainty whether the DBEs were interested in subconsulting work for this Agreement.
- E. Selected portions of the services to be performed by DBEs in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the DBE goal (including, where appropriate, breaking down subconsultant agreements into economically feasible units to facilitate DBE participation).
- F Provided interested DREs with adequate information about plans, specifications and requirements of this Agreement.
- G. Negotiated in good faith with interested DBEs, and not rejecting DBEs as unqualified without sound reasons, based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities.
- H. Made efforts to assist interested DBEs in obtaining any bonding, lines of credit or insurance required by the Commission or by the Engineer.
- I. Made effective use of the services of available disadvantaged business organizations, minority contractors' groups, disadvantaged business assistance offices, and other organizations that provide assistance in the recruitment and placement of DBE firms.

8. Good Faith Efforts to Obtain DBE Participation: If the Engineer's agreed DBE goal amount as specified is less than the established DBE goal given, then the Engineer certifies that good faith efforts were taken by Engineer in an attempt to obtain the level of DBE participation set by MoDOT's External Civil Rights.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A REVISED MISSOURI HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION MUNICIPAL AGREEMENT FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS ALONG ROUTE 32 & 61. (Job No. J9P3392)

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Transportation ("MoDOT") wishes to make improvements to Routes 32 & 61 in the city limits of the City of Ste. Genevieve ("City"); and

SECTION 1. The Board of Aldermen of the City of Ste. SECTION 2. MISSOURI HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION MUNICIPAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (hereinafter, "Commission") and the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri, a municipal corporation (hereinafter, "City").

WITNESSETH:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and representations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- IMPROVEMENT DESIGNATION: The public improvement designated as Route 32, Ste. Genevieve County, Job No. J9P3392 shall consist of coldmilling and resurfacing lanes and shoulders, signal work, and drainage improvements.
- (2) IMPROVEMENT WITHIN CITY: The improvement within the City is located as follows:

Route 32 Improvements: Beginning just east of Shultze Lane, log mi. 280.638 run in generally an easterly direction to just North of Gerard Street, log mi. 282.677.

Route 61 Improvements: Beginning west of the intersection of Route 32, log mi. 228.898 run in generally an easterly direction to east of the intersection of Route 32, log mi. 282.677.

- EXTENT OF AGREEMENT: This Agreement shall apply only to the portion of the improvement lying within the city limits as they exist on the date this Agreement is executed by the City.
- LOCATION: The general location of the public improvement is shown on an attached sketch marked "Exhibit A" and made a part of this Agreement. The detailed location of the improvement is shown on the plans prepared by the Commission for the above-designated route and project.
- PURPOSE: It is the intent of this Agreement to outline the parties' responsibilities with respect to the construction and maintenance of those improvements to the State Highway System located within the City limits described in paragraphs (1) and (2) above and designated as Commission Job No. J9P3392.

- (6) <u>RIGHT-OF-WAY USE</u>: The City grants the right to use the right-of-way of public roads, streets, alleys and any other property owned by the City as necessary for construction and maintenance of said public improvement.
- (7) <u>CLOSE AND VACATE</u>: The City shall temporarily close and vacate all streets or roads, or parts thereof, which may be necessary to permit the construction of the project in accordance with the detailed plans.

(8) UTILITY RELOCATION:

- (A) The Commission and the City shall cooperate to secure the temporary or permanent removal, relocation, or adjustment of public utilities or private lines, poles, wires, conduits, and pipes located on the right-of-way of existing public ways as necessary for construction of the improvement and the cost shall be borne by such public utilities or the owners of the facilities except where the City is by existing franchise or agreement obligated to pay all or a portion of such cost, in which case the City will pay its obligated portion of the cost.
- (B) The Commission shall secure the removal, relocation, or adjustment of any public or private utilities located upon private easements and shall pay any costs incurred therein.
- (C) It is understood and agreed by the parties to this Agreement that no city-owned utility facilities will require relocation or adjustment in connection with this improvement, but that should utility facilities be discovered at any time during development or construction of this improvement, relocation or adjustment of the same will be done and performed under a supplemental agreement covering the subject, and in accordance with Commission policy then in effect on division of costs for adjustment of utility facilities.
- In cases of public utilities owned by the City which must be moved. adjusted, or altered to accommodate construction of this improvement, and such cityowned utilities, poles, wires, conduits, and pipes are located within the present city limits and located on an existing city street, not state highway right-of-way, but being taken over by the Commission as a part of its highway right-of-way, the City will perform the necessary removal, adjustment, alterations and relocation, and the Commission will reimburse the City except as otherwise provided. The City shall perform the removal, adjustment, alterations and relocation in accordance with the detail plans, estimates of costs and bills of materials prepared by the City in accordance with Federal Aid Policy Guide, Title 23 CFR Subchapter G, Part 645, Subpart A (FAPG 23 CFR 645A), dated December 9, 1991 and any revision of it, and approved by the Commission's District Engineer, and shall perform all work and keep the records of the costs in accordance with FAPG 23 CFR 645A and its revisions. Upon the completion of any such work and on receipt by the Commission of the original and four copies of a bill for the actual costs incurred by the City in making any such removal, adjustment, alteration and relocation, the Commission shall reimburse the City for the actual cost necessitated by construction

of this public improvement. The Commission's obligation toward the cost of any such removal, adjustment, alteration and relocation shall extend only to those costs incurred in accordance with FAPG 23 CFR 645A and its revisions.

- (E) Should it be necessary to alter, relocate or adjust any city-owned utility facilities outside the present city limits on public right-of-way or on state highway right-of-way within or outside the city limits or within the right-of-way of a public way other than a city street or alley, the alteration, relocation, or adjustment shall be made by the City at its cost.
- (F) The City agrees that any installation, removal, relocation, maintenance, or repair of public or private utilities involving work within highway right-of-way included in this project shall be done only in accordance with the general rules and regulations of the Commission and after a permit for the particular work has been obtained from the Commission's District Engineer or his authorized representative. Similarly, the City will allow no work on the highway right-of-way involving excavation or alteration in any manner of the highway as constructed, including but not limited to driveway connections, except in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commission and only after a permit for the specific work has been obtained from the Commission's District Engineer or his authorized representative. The City shall take whatever actions that are necessary to assure compliance with this Subsection.
- (9) TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES: The installation, operation and maintenance of all traffic signals, pavement markings, signs, and devices on the improvement, including those between the highway and intersecting streets shall be under the exclusive jurisdiction and at the cost of the Commission. The City shall not install, operate, or maintain any traffic signals, signs or other traffic control devices on the highway or on streets and highways at any point where they intersect this highway without approval of the Commission.
- (10) <u>PERMITS</u>: The Commission shall secure any necessary approvals or permits from the Surface Transportation Board, the Public Service Commission of Missouri, or any other state or federal regulating authority required to permit the construction and maintenance of the highway.
- (11) <u>COMMENCEMENT OF WORK</u>: <u>After acquisition of the necessary right-of-way</u>, the Commission shall construct the highway in accordance with final detailed plans approved by the Federal Highway Administration (or as they may be changed from time to time by the Commission with the approval of the FHWA) at such time as federal and state funds are allocated to the public improvement in an amount sufficient to pay for the federal and state government's proportionate share of construction. The obligation of the Commission toward the actual construction of the public improvement shall be dependent upon the completion of plans in time to obligate federal funds for such construction, upon approval of the plans by the FHWA, upon the award by the Commission of the contract for the construction, and upon the approval of the award by the FHWA.

(12) MAINTENANCE:

- (A) Except as provided in this Agreement, upon completion of the public improvement, the Commission will maintain all portions of the improvement within the Commission owned right-of-way. Maintenance by the Commission shall not in any case include maintenance or repair of sidewalks whether new or used in place, water supply lines, sanitary or storm sewers (except those storm sewers constructed by the Commission to drain the highway), city-owned utilities within the right-of-way or the removal of snow other than the machine or chemical removal from the traveled portion of the highway.
- (B) When it is necessary to revise or adjust city streets, the right-of-way acquired for these adjustments and connections will be deeded to the City.
- (13) <u>ACCEPTED WITHIN HIGHWAY SYSTEM</u>: Effective upon execution of this Agreement, the Commission temporarily accepts the portion of the City street system described in this Agreement as part of the State Highway System for the purposes of this project. However, during the construction period contemplated in this Agreement:
- (A) The Commission will assume no police or traffic control functions not obligatory upon Commission immediately prior to the execution of this Agreement, and
- (B) The City shall perform or cause to be performed normal maintenance on the project site.
- (14) <u>CITY TO MAINTAIN</u>: Upon completion of construction of this improvement, the City shall accept control and maintenance of the improved City street that was temporarily accepted as part of the State Highway System for the purposes of this project pursuant to paragraph (16) above and shall thereafter keep, control, and maintain the same as, and for all purposes, a part of the City street system at its own cost and expense and at no cost and expense whatsoever to the Commission. All obligations of the Commission with respect to the City street system under this Agreement shall cease upon completion of the improvement.
- (15) <u>POLICE POWERS</u>: It is the intent of the parties to this Agreement that the City shall retain its police powers with respect to the regulation of traffic upon the improvement contemplated. However, the City will enact, keep in force, and enforce only such ordinances relating to traffic movement and parking restrictions as may be approved by the Commission and as are not in conflict with any regulations for federal aid. The Commission shall not arbitrarily withhold approval of reasonable traffic regulations, signs, and markings which will permit the movement of traffic in accordance with accepted traffic regulation practices.
- (16) <u>RESTRICTION OF PARKING</u>: Since the improvement is being designed and constructed to accommodate a maximum amount of traffic with a minimum amount of right-of-way, the City shall take whatever actions that are necessary to prevent parking

upon the highway or any part of the area of the highway right-of-way within the limits of the improvement.

- (17) <u>OUTDOOR ADVERTISING</u>: No billboards or other advertising signs or devices or vending or sale of merchandise will be permitted within the right-of-way limits of the project and the City shall take whatever actions that are necessary to enforce this Section.
- (18) <u>WITHHOLDING OF FUNDS</u>: In the event that the City fails, neglects, or refuses to enact, keep in force or enforce ordinances specified or enacts ordinances contrary to the provisions in this Agreement, or in any other manner fails, neglects or refuses to perform any of the obligations assumed by it under this Agreement, the Commission may, after serving written request upon the City for compliance and the City's failure to comply, withhold the expenditure of further funds for maintenance, improvement, construction, or reconstruction of the state highway system in the City.
- (19) <u>FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION</u>: This Agreement is entered into subject to approval by the Federal Highway Administration and is further subject to the availability of federal and state funds for this construction.

(20) INDEMNIFICATION:

- (A) To the extent allowed or imposed by law, the City shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and department employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the City's wrongful or negligent performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- (B) In no event shall the language of this Agreement constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation for either party's rights or defenses with regard to each party's applicable sovereign, governmental, or official immunities and protections as provided by federal and state constitution or law.
- (21) <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: Any change in this Agreement, whether by modification or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment approved and signed by representatives of the City and Commission, respectively, each of whom being duly authorized to execute the contract amendment on behalf of the City and Commission, respectively.
- (22) <u>COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE</u>: The Commission's Southeast District Engineer is designated as the Commission's representative for the purpose of administering the provisions of this Agreement. The Commission's representative may designate by written notice other persons having the authority to act on behalf of the Commission in furtherance of the performance of this Agreement.
 - (23) <u>CITY REPRESENTATIVE:</u> The City's City Administrator is designated as

the City's representative for the purpose of administering the provisions of this Agreement. The City's representative may designate by written notice other persons having the authority to act on behalf of the City in furtherance of the performance of this Agreement.

- (24) <u>NOTICES</u>: Any notice or other communication required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given three (3) days after delivery by United States mail, regular mail postage prepaid, or upon receipt by personal or facsimile delivery, addressed as follows:



- (26) <u>LAW OF MISSOURI TO GOVERN</u>: This Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri. The City shall comply with all local, state and federal laws and regulations relating to the performance of the contract.
- (27) <u>VENUE</u>: It is agreed by the parties that any action at law, suit in equity, or other judicial proceeding to enforce or construe this Agreement, or regarding its alleged breach, shall be instituted only in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.
- (28) <u>SOLE BENEFICIARY</u>: This Agreement is made for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the Commission and the City.

- (29) <u>AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE</u>: The signers of this Agreement warrant that they are acting officially and properly on behalf of their respective institutions and have been duly authorized, directed and empowered to execute this Agreement.
- (30) <u>SECTION HEADINGS</u>: All section headings contained in this Agreement are for the convenience of reference only and are not intended to define or limit the scope of any provision of this Agreement.

Re: Marijuana Tax Issue



Issue:

The Missouri Constitution allows for the collection of sales taxes for adult use marijuana by taxing authorities. We do not have an entity to tax at this point but we can place this question on the ballot in April to prepare for the possibility in the future. This tax is only for sales of adult use marijuana products.

Since we have the municipal election coming up in April I wanted to give the board the option to approve this to go on the ballot. The Proposition must be submitted to the County Clerk by January 24, 2023.

Recommendation:

Approve the ordinance to place the tax question on the ballot.

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A SALES TAX AT A RATE OF THREE PERCENT ON ALL TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY RETAIL SALES OF ADULT USE MARIJUANA SOLD WITHIN THE CITY OF STE. GENEVIEVE, MISSOURI, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 2.6(5) OF THE MISSOURI CONSTITUTION SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL BY THE VOTERS OF THE CITY AT THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 4, 2023; DESIGNATING THE FORM OF BALLOT; AND DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO PROVIDE NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION.

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2022, the electors of the State of Missouri approved Amendment 3 to the Missouri Constitution enacting Section 2 of Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution effective December 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the newly enacted Article XIV, section 2.6(5) of the Missouri Constitution authorizes the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri to impose, by ordinance, an additional sales tax in amount not to exceed three percent (3%) on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold in such political subdivision subject to approval by voters of the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen find that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri to impose a sales tax of three percent (3%) on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold in the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri and to submit the same to the voters of the City for approval by a majority of those voting at the general municipal election to be held on April 4, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF STE. GENEVIEVE, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1 – ADULT USE MARIJUANA SALES TAX</u>. A sales tax at the rate of three percent (3%) on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold in the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri, as authorized by Article XIV, section 2.6(5) of the Missouri Constitution, is hereby imposed. The tax imposed hereunder shall be in addition to any and all other sales taxes allowed by law.

SECTION 2 – EFFECTIVE DATE. The sales tax imposed by this Ordinance shall not be effective unless approved by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified voters voting thereon at the General Municipal Election to be held on April 4, 2023, at which election a proposal to authorize the Board of Aldermen of the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri, to impose the tax herein provided for shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Ste. Genevieve.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING SECTION 700.010 DISCLOSURE OF UTILITY BILLING RECORDS

WHEREAS, the City of Ste. Genevieve maintains certain records, including individual financial information, regarding utility bills and payments for those utility bills; and

WHEREAS, Section 610.021 RSMo. has been amended to add Paragraph (25) which allows for a municipality to establish individually identifiable customer usage and billing records, for customers of a municipally owned utility, as closed records pursuant to the Sunshine Law; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ste. Genevieve desires to enact this ordinance to make a determination that those individually identifiable customer usage and billing records, for customers of the municipally owned utilities of the City of Ste. Genevieve, be closed records and to provide a consistent policy with regard to the disclosure of those records.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF STE. GENEVIEVE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City of Ste. Genevieve enacts and adopts Section 700.010, which shall read as follows:

SECTION 700.010 Individually Identifiable Customer Usage and Billing Records

Individually Identifiable Customer Usage and Billing Records for Customers of the utilities of the City of Ste. Genevieve shall be considered to be closed records pursuant to Section 610.021 RSMo. Unless the records are requested by the customer, or authorized for release by the customer, no records shall be made available to the public, except for the customer's name, billing address, location of service and the dates of service provided. Any authorization by the customer to release information to a third party must be made in writing and signed by the customer. The City Administrator, or his or her designee, is authorized to use a standardized form release to be used by the City of Ste. Genevieve to facilitate customer release authorizations.

SECTION 2. If any provisions of this ordinance, or the application thereof to anyone or any circumstances, are held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application of such provisions shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be codified.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage and approval.

REQUEST:

To receive a Special Use Permit to operate a guest lodging establishment.

BACKGROUND

- The property is located in an R-2 General Residential Zone District.
- The property is bordered on the south, east, & west sides by residential lots with single family homes within the R-2 General Residential District. The property is bordered on the north side by Washington Street and other residential structures on the opposite side of the street that are also within the R-2 General Residential District.
- The property is a contributing structure within the Ste. Genevieve National Register Boundary and sits within the Ste. Genevieve National Landmark District. The original portion of the structure was built c. 1850 – 1875.
- The structure's current use is as a single family residence.
- The parcel is located within the FEMA-identified Zone A floodplain.
- There is no off-street parking available on this parcel. The applicant has provided an off-street parking location on a neighboring parcel to the south (John Vonder Harr, 166 N 3rd St.) to allow for off-street parking of his guests. Applicant has provided a map and signed document with his application. The off-street parking space provided is approximately 20' x

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant, VIO Properties LLC, wishes to operate a guest lodging establishment, commonly known as a "VRBO" or "AirBNB", within the single family residential structure at 320 Washington Street.

Specific Findings of Fact:

It is hereby found that the requested use, with the below-stated terms and conditions:

1. Will not substantially increase traffic hazards or congestion.

- 2. Will not adversely affect the character of the neighborhood.

- Owners shall maintain a business license with the City of Ste. Genevieve under Municipal Code Chapter 605 Business Licensing. Owners shall be current on all City lodging tax payments.
- 3. Owners shall provide in a conspicuous location within the lodging unit at all times an operable ABC 5 lb. fire extinguisher.
- 4. Owners shall insure prior to each guest arrival, that exterior lighting at the entry door and stairway is operable.
- 5. No amplified music shall be played outside after 10 pm.
- 6. Owners shall post in a conspicuous location within the dwelling rules and conditions posted herein for guests to observe. It shall contain emergency telephone numbers of the Owners, the Police Department and Fire Department. It shall include a copy of the current Occupancy Permit. Owners shall provide phone number and address of the City of Ste. Genevieve's Building Department for any complaints about the condition of the property or services provided incident to the guests' stay.
- 7. Owner shall provide empty and clean trash receptacles at the property on the first day of each booked guest period for guest use. Owner shall legally dispose of guest trash and recyclables within 24 hours of any guest departure. Legal disposal includes storage of accumulated trash in approved receptacles or containers in such manner as not to create a nuisance. Trash receptacles shall not be placed at the street curb except on designated days by the Solid Waste hauler.
- 8. Signage identifying the guest lodging home shall be small and simple in nature and be attached to the structure so as to easily identify the entrance to the unit.
- 9. The applicant is to provide not less than one (1) off-street parking space for use by guests.






