

We believe once we are finished, we will have a display that the City, County, and the American legion Post 150 can and will be proud of for years to come.



The board wanted to get a better understanding of financing available to cities after having Cochran perform a 15 Pavement Preventative Maintenance Plan. The yearly cost for the plan is higher than the yearly allocation the city makes to street overlays and concrete replacement.
