Our judge, award-winning Illinois plein air painter Michael Anderson, will make the tough decisions about who receives \$2,400 in cash awards.

For those who haven't tried it, plein air (painting outdoors) is a way to personally connect with nature. A painting limited by changing light creates an unusual sense of focus - painters often report losing track of space and time. Art thus created is characterized by freshness and spontaneity. Three of

the subjects are specified by purchase award sponsors, but for the general awards artists are free to portray any scene found in the County. Visitors may get a glimpse of original paintings being made in real time during the four days of competition.

For those who love art, these paintings capture a subject and a moment in colorful brushstrokes. Opportunities to view the many works produced will begin Saturday, September 23rd at the Awards Reception from 6 to 9pm and continue Sunday between 11am and 2pm. People's Choice voting ends at Noon. Please cast your ballot on either day.

Night Paint to Capture 4th Friday Vibe

On September 22nd, Silver Sycamore Gallery of Fine Art is sponsoring a timed Purchase Award in the Plein Air competition to capture the vibe of the 4th Friday Art Walk. Artists can choose a spot along the Art Walk route and begin painting at 5pm, capturing either twilight (after sunset and before dark) or nocturne (the glow of artificial street and window lights).

Artists begin turning in their paintings at Silver Sycamore for judging at 8pm.

Partnership with County Library Expanded



The idea that "books open doors that expand our minds" inspired workshops in which kids, teens and members created 27 polymer clay doors depicting literary themes of adventure, home, mystery and the supernatural. The metal bookends to which they were glued were provided by the Ste. Genevieve County Library, who plans to feature them in a "seek and find" activity for youth this fall. In addition to the "Art Book Wall" installation and the rotating Member Exhibit maintained by the Guild, the "Ancient Art in Ste. Genevieve County" exhibit will be on display at the Library in a large case during Native American Heritage Month in November.

POW Mural Rescued by Guild on Display

The original mural was 16 feet long, painted with house paint onto sheet rock by Italian prisoners at Camp Weingarten in 1945, and donated to the Guild in 1994, damaged during its removal from the Jaycees hall. Guild Historian **Anna Kirchner** was not only instrumental in rescuing the mural but also restoring it to museum-worthy status in 2019. The best three panels are displayed on the Ste. Genevieve Museum Learning Center's 2nd Floor.

The two panels pictured were donated to the Jefferson Barracks POW-MIA Museum through connections made by **Vicki Cummings**. That Museum is finally opening on September 16th. "We will be displaying the two mural pieces along with their story - in fact the west first floor of the Museum is now referred to as "The Mural Room", according to the curator. A rewarding finish to a long-term Art Guild project.
