# November 9, 2023

- 1. City offices will be closed for Veterans Day on November 10 and the Thanksgiving holiday November 23 & 24.
- 2. I will be out of the office November 27 through December 1 and December 7 & 8.
- 3. Our new Tourism Director starts Monday, December 4, at 8a and will be mostly involved with onboarding activities that morning at city hall.
- 4. We have a walk through with landscapers/lawn companies interested in bidding on the cemetery grass cutting at Memorial and Crestlawn Cemeteries November 13. Bids will be due on December 13.
- 5. Bids are due November 22 for electric installation for the Main St. Park EV chargers.
- 6. Crews are mudding and taping this week at city hall and we will meet with the painter to look at paint colors on Tuesday. We are looking at more of an earthtone feel for the interior of the facility.
- 7. We started the process Friday with Genasys to set up our texting notification system. The plan is to start training staff in middle December and have it up and running before Christmas. Then we will set up links on Facebook and the website for residents to start signing up.

# Tourism Report 11/9/2023

Upcoming events: Downtown Ste. Genevieve's Cookie Crumb Trail on Nov. 11. The Holiday Christmas Festival is Dec. 2 & 3 with the tree lighting ceremony Dec. 1.

Website visitors are 5,700 for October with the majority of those folks looking at our events calendar and checking out Halloween details. # 2022 DPS Grant application

I have applied for a \$43,000 no match grant for radio replacement I received notification that the grant request for \$43,000 for radio equipment was fully funded. The State has given permission to order the radios. Radios have been ordered. Checked on the progress last week. Radios are in and being programmed. Should see install by the end of the month.

## 2023 DPS Grant

Received notification that the grant program will open soon. I intend to apply again to try to get some of our handheld radios upgraded. This will be a no matching funds grant, the same as the last 2 DPS grants. Grant has been submitted for approximately \$72,000. Grant has been approved. Waiting for permission from the state to order.

## **ARP Grant**

2023

Helmets are in and will be placed in service in the next 2 weeks. I am requesting the old helmets be declared surplus property so they can be disposed of. They have surpassed their useable life span per the NFPA.

#### 2024

I will be applying for all new fire hose and 8 sets of turnout gear in this year's grant request. This is a 50% match which can be in the form of money or "in kind match". We have budgeted for 4 sets of turnout gear and replacement of our 4 inch large diameter hose. If I write these into the grant, the purchases we were planning to make can be used as our match and would only require additional funding of approximately \$6,000.00 that would be available from the rural fire fund.

# **BUSINESS ITEMS.**

**EV Electric Estimate.** An estimate was received for the cost to install the EV Charging Station at the Main Street Park from ARCHKEY SOLUTIONS at \$12,900 with the estimated cost for concrete and retaining wall blocks an extra \$3,000.00. The \$3,000.00 can come out of park improvement funds but the \$12,900 has not been budgeted or set aside in ARPA funds. After discussion the Board would like to get bids on the project to see if they come in lower than the \$12,900.

Christmas Lights. Alderman Fahey has requested discussion on purchasing Christmas light/decoration for downtown. \$600.00 is currently budgeted and a suggestion was to put red and green lights in the downtown streetlights or use red and green plastic inserts. After discussion staff will see how many lights can be purchased with the \$600.00 and will offer the snowflakes that were used on the utility poles downtown to local merchants to use if they wish.

City Hall Sign Improvement. Happy would like the Board to consider new signage that would serve two purposes: 1.) Better visibility for the traveling public and 2.) More in line with the historic nature of period signs. A rough sketch was presented to the Board to give them an idea of what Happy has in mind. The Board directed Happy to proceed with the sign replacement. Alderman Bennett asked if signage could be provided for the Police Department as well and if something could be done with the windows in the police department so they match the new windows recently installed at City Hall.

**Surplus Existing Office Furniture.** With the move back into City Hall there will be surplus office furniture and a resolution will be prepared to surplus what will not be needed. Happy asked for direction from the Board that once its surplus do they want it sold, donated or given to a non for profit? After some discussion the Board suggested they try to sell it.

AN ORDINANCE CALLING FOR THE GENERAL ELECTION OF OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF STE. GENEVIEVE, MISSOURI TO BE HELD APRIL 2, 2024 AND PROVIDING NOTICE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

WHEREAS, State Election Laws and the Municipal Code of Ordinances of the City of Ste. Genevieve ("City") require that the City call for an election of officers to be conducted on April 2, 2024.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF STE. GENEVIEVE, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** The annual election of the officers of the City of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri shall be held on April 2, 2024 in conformity with section 79.030 RSMO 2000. At said election there shall be elected:

- 1. A member of the Board of Aldermen from the First Ward for the full term of two years.
- 2. A member of the Board of Aldermen from the First Ward for a one year term.
- 3. A member of the Board of Aldermen from the Second Ward for the full term of two years.
- 4. A member of the Board of Alderman from the Third Ward for the full term of two years.
- 5. A member of the Board of Aldermen from the Fourth Ward for the full term of two years.

**SECTION 2:** All persons desiring to be candidates for such offices, all persons desiring their names to be and appear as candidates for such offices upon the city ticket of the election aforesaid shall file their names within the City and with the City Clerk of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri at City Hall office located at 44 Plaza Drive, Ste. Genevieve, Missouri.

Filing shall commence on: And shall close on: December 5, 2023 at 8:00 a.m. December 26, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.

The office of the City Clerk will not be open on Saturdays, Sundays or those days declared a holiday by the City of Ste. Genevieve.

**SECTION 3:** Persons who, after filing their names wish to withdraw as such candidates must file their notice of withdrawal with the City Clerk in her office no later than 5:00 p.m. on December 26, 2023.

**SECTION 4:** The filing fee for candidates shall be \$25.00. In case of withdrawal of a candidate, there shall be no refund. All filing fees shall be paid to the City Clerk at the time of filing.

**SECTION 5:** The City Clerk shall certify such information as may be necessary to the Ste. Genevieve County Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the tenth Tuesday prior to the election and they shall conduct the election in accordance with the statutes of the State of Missouri relating to Fourth Class Cities.

**SECTION 6:** Before December 5, 2023, the City Clerk shall notify the general public of the opening file date, the offices to be filled, the proper place for filing and the closing filing date of the election, all pursuant to and in conformance with RSMO Section 115.127.5 and Chapter 105: Election of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ste. Genevieve.

**SECTION 7:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

**SECTION 8:** That all ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 9:** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction such portion shall be deemed separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 610.810 VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDERS TO COMPLY WITH STATE STATUTE SECTION 67.2689 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI

WHEREAS, the City of Ste. Genevieve has imposed a franchise fee of five percent (5%) of gross revenues for video services as authorized by Section 67.2689 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Legislature has amended Section 67.2689 to limit the maximum franchise fee that can be assessed pursuant to that statute as follows:

EFFECTIVE DATE	MAXIMUM SERVICE PROVIDER FEE
August 28, 2023	4.5%
August 28, 2024	4.0%
August 28, 2025	3.5%
August 28, 2026	3.0%
August 28, 2027	2.5%

**WHEREAS**, the City of Ste. Genevieve desires to be in compliance with the Missouri statute that authorizes the video services franchise fee.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERPERSONS OF THE CITY OF STE. GENEVIEVE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1**. Section 610.810 Video Service Providers shall be amended and replaced to read as follows:

- A. *Definitions*. The words and phrases used in this Section shall have the meaning as set forth in Section 67.2677, RSMo., or, if not defined therein, shall have such meanings as established by City Code.
- В. Franchise Fee. Pursuant to Section 67.2689, RSMo., and as partial compensation for use of the City's public rights-of-way, each video services provider or other person providing cable services or video services within the City shall, to the extent permitted by law, pay to the City a fee of four and one-half percent (4.5%) of the gross revenues from such video services provided in the geographic area of the City. Beginning August 28, 2024, the fee will be four percent (4%) of the gross revenues from such video services provided in the geographic area of the City. Beginning August 28, 2025, the fee will be three and one-half percent (3.5%) of the gross revenues from such video services provided in the geographic area of the City. Beginning August 28, 2026, the fee will be three percent (3%) of the gross revenues from such video services provided in the geographic area of the City. Beginning August 28, 2027, the fee will be two and one-half percent (2.5%) of the gross revenues from such video services provided in the geographic area of the City. Such payment shall be made as required by Section 67.2689, RSMo. The City shall have the right to audit any video services provider as authorized by Section 67.2691, RSMo. Late payments shall

- accrue interest due to the City compounded monthly at one and one-half percent (1.5%) or such other maximum rate as may be established by law.
- C. Customer Service Requirements. All video services providers providing service within the City shall adopt and comply with the minimum customer service requirements set forth in Section 67.2692, RSMo. Notice or receipt of this Section by a video services provider shall be deemed notice of the City invoking such customer service requirements.
- D. Rights-Of-Way Regulation — Indemnification — Permits and Compliance with Other Laws. Video service providers shall comply with the requirements of Sections 67.2707, 67.2709, RSMo., and all applicable ordinances and regulations consistent with Sections 67.1830 to 67.1846, RSMo., relating to use of the City's rights-of-way. Each video services provider shall indemnify and hold harmless the City and its officers, employees and agents from any loss or damage, including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees, as provided in such ordinances or regulations, but in no event less than the obligation on video services providers set forth in Section 67.2695, RSMo. The City may require documentation of such indemnification by written agreement or other instrument to the extent permitted by law. In addition, video services providers shall be subject to and comply with such supplementary provisions relating to placement, screening and location of facilities as provided in Section 405.145 of this Code, whether on public or private property, and such other applicable laws of the City, except as may be otherwise validly pre-empted. Notwithstanding any other ordinance to the contrary, no facilities to be used for video services shall be installed without obtaining a permit from the City authorizing the location and plans for such facilities; provided that this provision shall not apply to installation of otherwise lawful and authorized poles or wires.
- E. Public, Educational and Governmental Channels. Each video services provider shall designate a number of channels for public, educational and governmental programming consistent with Section 67.2703, RSMo.; provided that any greater number of channels as may be required in the incumbent cable franchise or franchise ordinance shall be required pursuant to Section 67.2703.2, RSMo. The City shall bear no cost relating to the transmission, availability or maintenance of such channels unless expressly authorized by the City in writing and approved by the Governing Body. Incumbent cable operators and other video services providers shall provide support for such public, educational and governmental channels consistent with Section 67.2703.8, RSMo.
- F. Continued Obligations. The obligations of a cable service provider or video services provider as set forth in any existing cable services or video services franchise or ordinance shall also continue to apply to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law.
- G. Reservation of Rights. The City retains all rights in Sections 67.2675 through 67.2714, RSMo., inclusive, and may take any and all actions permitted by law to exercise such rights or to enforce such obligations on providers of video services.

H	Notice. A copy of this Section shall be delivered to each video services provider operating in the City after notice to the City that such provider is authorized to provide service within the City; provided that the provisions of this Section shall, to the extent permitted by law, not be affected by any claimed or actual failure of a service provider to have received delivery of a copy of this Section.

#### **OWNER-CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT**

This is an Agreement made and entered into the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_, by and between the **City of Ste. Genevieve**, a municipal corporation (hereinafter called the "Owner") and **Jokerst, Inc.**, 16444 Highway 32, Ste. Genevieve, Missouri, (hereinafter called the "Contractor").

The project is identified as the Jefferson Street Sidewalk Improvements, as detailed by Cochran Engineering plans SC22-1456 in the City of Ste. Genevieve, (hereinafter called "Project")

## **WITNESSETH:**

The Contractor and the Owner, for the consideration set forth herein, agree as follows:

# **ARTICLE I**

#### **The Contract Documents**

The Contract Documents include the Conditions of the Contract (General Conditions of Owner-Contractor Agreement), the Construction Schedule, all Addenda issued prior to the execution of this Contract, and all Modifications issued after execution of this Contract, which together with this Agreement form the Contract, and are all as fully a part of the Contract as if attached to this Agreement or repeated herein. All definitions set forth in the General Conditions of Owner-Contractor Agreement are applicable to this Agreement.

The Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties, and supersedes prior negotiations, representations and agreements, whether written or oral. An enumeration of the Contract Documents, other than Modifications, is set forth in Article X.

## **ARTICLE II**

#### Scope of Work

The Contractor, acting as an independent contractor, shall faithfully and fully perform the Work described in, and shall do everything required by, the Contract Documents or reasonably inferable there from, for the complete construction of the project. The Contractor represents and warrants that he has special skills which qualify him to perform the Work in accordance with the Contract and that he is free to perform all such Work and is not a party to any other agreement, written or oral, the performance of which would prevent or interfere with the performance, in whole or in part, of the Work.

#### ARTICLE III

# **Time of Completion**

- (a) All time limits stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence. The Work to be performed under the Contract shall commence within (7) consecutive calendar days of the date of the written Notice to Proceed from the Owner to the Contractor, and shall be substantially completed within <a href="Forty-five (45)">Forty-five (45)</a> consecutive calendar days from and including the date of said written Notice to Proceed, subject to adjustments of this Contract Time as provided in the Contract Documents.
- (b) Contractor shall pay, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, the sum of \$500 for each consecutive calendar day after the Final Completion date that the Work has not been completed. The total amount so payable to the Owner as liquidated damages may be deducted from any sums due or to become due to Contractor from Owner.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

#### The Contract Sum and Payments

The Owner agrees to pay, and the Contractor agrees to accept, for the performance of the Contract, the sum of **\$66,530**, subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents. The bid documents as accepted by the City are attached for reference. Based upon proper application, final payment within 30 days after the Work is fully completed and accepted by the Owner and the Contract is fully performed.

# ARTICLE V

#### Performance of the Work

- (a) The Contractor shall prepare and submit for the Owner's approval,
- (1) a Construction Schedule which shall indicate the dates for starting and completing the various stages of construction, <u>and</u>
- (2) a Traffic Control Plan indicating the location of all proposed signage, detours, road closures throughout the Project which adequately address the Traffic Control Plan of the proposed Work. All traffic control shall be according to the standards of the latest edition of the <u>Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices</u> developed by the Federal Highway Administration. No Work will commence until the Contractor's Schedule and Traffic Control Plan is submitted and approved by the Owner.

- (b) Completion of the Work in accordance with the time limits set forth in the Construction Schedule is an essential condition of the Contract.
- (c) If the Contractor falls behind the Construction Schedule for any reason, he shall promptly take, and cause his Subcontractors to take, such action as is necessary to remedy the delay, and shall submit promptly to the Owner for approval a supplementary schedule or progress chart demonstrating the manner in which the delay will be remedied; provided, however, that if the delay is excusable under Article VI hereof, the Contractor will not be required to take, or cause his Subcontractors to take, any action which would increase the overall cost of the Work (whether through overtime premium pay or otherwise), unless the Owner shall have agreed in writing to reimburse the Contractor for such increase in cost. Any increase in cost incurred in remedying a delay which is not excusable under Article VI hereof shall be borne by the Contractor.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **Delays Beyond Contractor's Control**

- (a) If the Contractor fails to complete the Work in accordance with the Construction Schedule as a result of the act or neglect of the Owner, or by strikes, lockouts, fire or other similar causes beyond the Contractor's control, then, and to the extent of such delays, the Contractor shall not be required to pay liquidated damages to the Owner pursuant to Paragraph (b) of Article III hereof, provided the Contractor uses his best efforts to remedy the delay in the manner specified in Paragraph (c) of Article V hereof. If, as a result of any such cause beyond the Contractor's control, the delay in completion of the Work in accordance with the Construction Schedule is so great that it cannot be remedied in the aforesaid manner, or if the backlog of work is so great that it cannot be remedied without incurring additional cost which the Owner does not authorize, then the time of completion and the Construction Schedule shall be extended pursuant to a Change Order for the minimum period of delay occasioned by such cause. The period of delay and extension shall be determined by the Owner.
- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing Paragraph (a), no extension of time shall be granted for any delay the cause of which occurs more than seven (7) days before claim therefor is made in writing by the Contractor to the Owner, and no extension of time shall be granted if the Contractor could have avoided the need for such extension by the exercise of reasonable care and foresight. In the case of a continuing cause of delay, only one claim is necessary.
  - (c) Weather may constitute a cause for granting an extension of time.
- (d) Except to the extent that a delay is caused by the Owner, the Contractor's sole remedy shall consist of his rights under this Article VI.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

## Changes in the Work

- (a) The Owner may make changes within the general scope of the Contract by altering, adding to or deducting from the Work, the Contract Sum being adjusted accordingly. All such changes in the Work shall be executed under the conditions of the Contract. No extra work or change shall be made except pursuant to a Change Order from the Owner in accordance with the General Conditions. Any claim for an increase in the Contract Sum resulting from any such change in the Work shall be made by the Contractor in accordance with the General Conditions.
- (b) If the requested change would result in a delay in the Construction Schedule, the provisions of Paragraph (c) of Article V and of Article VI hereof shall apply. If the requested change would result in a decrease in the time required to perform the Work, the completion date and the Construction Schedule shall be adjusted by agreement between the parties to reflect such decrease.
- (c) Any adjustment in the Contract Sum for duly authorized extra work or change in the Work shall be determined based on the unit prices previously specified, to the extent such unit prices are applicable. To the extent such unit prices are not applicable, the adjustment in the Contract Sum shall, at the option of the Owner, be determined by an acceptable lump sum properly itemized and supported by sufficient substantiating data to permit evaluation, or by an acceptable cost plus percentage or fixed fee.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

#### Termination by Owner

(a) If the Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, or if the Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or if a receiver is appointed on account of the Contractor's insolvency, or if the Contractor persistently or repeatedly fails, except in cases for which extension of time is provided, to make progress in accordance with the Construction Schedule, or if the Contractor fails to make prompt payment to Subcontractors for material or labor, or persistently disregards laws, ordinances or the instructions of the Owner, or otherwise breaches any provision of the Contract, the Owner may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy, by giving written notice to the Contractor and his Surety, terminate the Contract, take possession of the Work and of all materials and equipment thereon and finish the Work by whatever method the Owner may deem expedient. In such case, the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any further payment until the Work is finished. If the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum shall exceed the expenses

of finishing the Work, including additional architectural, managerial and administrative expenses, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor. If such expenses shall exceed the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the Owner promptly upon demand.

In the event of termination pursuant to this Paragraph, the Contractor, upon the request of the Owner, shall promptly assign to the Owner in the manner and to the extent directed by the Owner all right, title and interest of the Contractor under any subcontracts, purchase orders which the Contractor is a party and which relate to the Work.

(b) Performance of the Work hereunder may be terminated by the Owner by giving three (3) days prior written notice to the Contractor if the Owner, in its sole discretion, decides to discontinue or suspend construction. In the event of such termination, as opposed to termination pursuant to Paragraph (a) of this Article VIII, the Contract Sum shall be reduced in an equitable manner by agreement between the parties. The Contractor will not be entitled to payment of profit on work not performed.

## **ARTICLE IX**

## Contractor's Liability Insurance

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain in full force and effect the following insurance coverage with an insurance carrier acceptable to the Owner:

The policy shall be endorsed to cover the contractual liability of the Contractor under the General Conditions.

The Contractor and his Subcontractors shall procure and maintain during the life of this Agreement insurance of the types and minimum amounts as follows:

- (a) Workers' Compensation in full compliance with statutory requirements of Federal and State of Missouri law and Employers' Liability coverage in the amount of \$2,000,000.
  - (b) Comprehensive General Liability and Bodily Injury Including Death: \$1,000,000 each person \$1,000,000 each occurrence

    Umbrella Liability \$3,000,000 each occurrence \$3,000,000 aggregate
  - (c) Comprehensive Automobile Liability, Bodily Injury
    Including Death: \$1,000,000 each person \$1,000,000 each occurrence
    Property Damage: \$1,000,000 each accident
  - (d) Personal and ADV Injury Including Death: \$1,000,000 each occurrence \$2,000,000 aggregate

The Owner's Protective Policy shall name the Owner as the insured. Certificates evidencing such insurance shall be furnished the Owner prior to Contractor commencing the Work on this Project. The certificates must state, "The City of Ste. Genevieve and Employees, are included as an additional insured as required by written contract under the General Liability Policy with respect to work performed by the named insured on the above listed project."

THE CONTRACT CONTAINS A BINDING ARBITRATION PROVISION WHICH MAY BE ENFORCED BY THE PARTIES.

**Size of Lot:** 0.61 acres, 26,000 Sq. Ft.(+/-). Front of lot along Market Street 165' (+/-), East side of lot 190' (+/-), South side if lot 170' (+/-), and West side of lot 185' (+/-).

#### **REQUEST:**

To receive a Special Use Permit to erect a 4' x 8' freestanding, non-illuminated sign at 1020 Market Street.

#### DATA:

- The property is bordered by residential properties on the north, east, and west; it is bordered by and allows access to a commercial property on the south. Specifically, it is bordered to the north by Market Street and across Market by residential properties, all lying within the R-1 Single Family Residential District. It is bordered to the east and west by other residential properties. It is bordered to the south by a commercial property, which lies within the I-2 Heavy Industrial District.
- The proposed sign is not digital LED which is only permitted in specific areas of the city.
   The proposed sign is also not illuminated.
- The property sits outside the National Register Historic District.
- The proposed sign is an identification sign for the business located on the south side of the property. The sign will be On-Premises, located within a tract of land owned by L & H Rentals.
- The proposed sign would be a freestanding sign on poles (see diagram below).
   Freestanding signs are allowed within an R-1 District with a Special Use Permit. The proposed sign would not be lit.

- The proposed sign placement would sit approximately 16' from the property line along Market Street & approximately 10' from the driveway edge (as shown below).
- Municipal Code Section 405.205 (A) 1 Purpose states "Signs constitute a separate and distinct use of the premises upon which they are placed and also affect the use of adjacent roads, streets, walkways and other properties. The provisions of this sign ordinance are made to establish reasonable and objective regulations for all signs in this municipality which are visible to the public, in order to protect the general public health, safety, welfare, convenience and aesthetics. The ordinance is also intended to serve the public's need to be given helpful directions, and to be informed of available products, businesses, and services."
- Municipal Code Section 405.205 (B) (13) Definitions defines a Freestanding sign as "The
  general term for any sign which is permanently affixed to the ground and on a foundation. It
  is supported on a foundation by one (1) or more upright poles or braces, and is not attached
  to a building or any other structure."
- Municipal Code Section 405.205 (C) Applicability states "A sign may be erected, placed, established, painted, created or maintained in the jurisdiction only in conformance with the standards, procedures, exemptions and other requirements of this Article. These regulations apply to both commercial and non-commercial messages."
- Municipal Code Section 405.205 (E) (9) General Provisions states "Signs, including supports, shall be set back from any right-of-way or access easement at least ten (10) feet, with the exception of signs within the "C-2" Central Business District." The proposed sign would be minimally 10' from the Market Street ROW.
- Municipal Code Section 405.205 (F) Table Summary Of Permitted Signs provides that onpremises "Freestanding" sign types are permitted within an R-1 Zone District with a Special use Permit.
- Municipal Code Section 405.200 (A) Special Use Regulations states "Subject to the
  provisions of this Section, the Board of Alderman of the City of Ste. Genevieve may, after
  public hearing before the Board of Aldermen and after study and report by the City Planning
  and Zoning Commission, authorize special uses in any district as herein qualified from
  which the uses are otherwise prohibited based on whether such building or use will:
  - 1. Substantially increase traffic hazards or congestion.
  - 2. Adversely affect the character of the neighborhood.
  - 3. Substantially increase fire hazards.
  - 4. Adversely affect the general welfare of the community.
  - 5. Overtax public utilities.
  - 6. Be in conflict with the Comprehensive City Plan."
- Municipal Code Section 405.200 (B) states: "If the Board's finding should be negative to the above, then the application may be granted; if affirmative as to any subject, then such permit shall be denied. In the granting of a special use permit, the Board of Aldermen may impose, and the Planning and Zoning Commission may recommend, appropriate conditions and safeguards as may be deemed necessary to ensure compliance with the requirements of the zoning ordinance and to protect adjacent property and conserve property values."

• Municipal Code Section 405.200 (D) states the following uses are authorized providing they comply with all the regulations set forth in this Chapter for the district in which such use is located.., (23) All uses by which special use permits are required by other Sections of this Chapter."

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant, Buchheit Logistics, wishes to place a 4' x 8' double-sided, non-illuminated, freestanding sign on the property at 1020 Market in order to identify their business and guide truck traffic to the appropriate access point.

### Specific Findings of Fact:

It is hereby found that the requested use with the below-stated terms and conditions:

- 1. Will not substantially increase traffic hazards or congestion.
- 2. Will not adversely affect the character of the neighborhood.
- 3. Will not substantially increase fire hazards.
- 4. Will not adversely affect the general welfare of the community.
- 5. Will not overtax public utilities.
- 6. Does not conflict with the Comprehensive City Plan

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends the following Standard Motion: APPROVAL conditioned on the following:

#### Terms and Conditions:

- 1. Prior to construction, applicant must submit sign permit application and construction documents in accordance with Municipal Code and be issued a Sign Permit.
- 2. Abide by all regulations in Municipal Code regarding signs including:
  - a. Every sign permitted shall be kept in good condition and repair.
  - b. Any sign structure that has no message or no sign face for a continuous period of six (6) months or more or for which has advertisement that no longer applies shall be considered an abandoned sign and removed within thirty (30) days after written notification.






Diagram of proposed sign.




