

2023 DPS Grant

Received notification that the grant program will open soon. I intend to apply again to try to get some of our handheld radios upgraded. This will be a no matching funds grant, the same as the last 2 DPS grants. Grant has been submitted for approximately \$72,000. Grant has been approved. Radios on order anticipate delivery end of the month or first part of next month.

2024 DPS Grant

Have started the application for no match required grant for truck intercom systems. This is the same grant that we received all of the radio upgrades from. Application is due June 14th.

ARP Grant

All ordered equipment is in service, and invoices have been turned over to Sue. Working on the closeout process.

2024

I will be applying for all new fire hoses and 8 sets of turnout gear in this year's grant request. This is a 50% match which can be in the form of money or "in kind match". We have budgeted for 4 sets of turnout gear and replacement of our 4-inch large diameter hose. If I write these into the grant, the purchases we were planning to make can be used as our match and would only require additional funding of approximately \$6,000.00 that would be available from the rural fire fund. Grant has been submitted. Marked as in p0rogress working on hose and turnout gear specs to go for bids.

MINUTES OF THE STE. GENEVIEVE BOARD OF ALDERMEN WORK SESSION MAY 23, 2024

The work session of the Ste. Genevieve Board of Aldermen was called to order by Mayor Keim at 6:44 p.m. with the following members present:

Mayor Brian Keim Alderman Bob Donovan Alderman Mike Raney Alderman Eric Bennett Alderwoman Amie Dobbs

Alderman Patrick Fahey Alderman Joe Prince Alderman Joe Steiger

ABSENT: Alderman Jeff Eydmann

A motion by Alderman Donovan, second by Alderman Steiger to approve the work session agenda as presented. Motion carried 7-0-1 with Alderman Eydmann absent.

BUSINESS ITEMS.

- **Fire District Fund Expenditure.** Attorney Mark Bishop explained that city funding can be used for survey work to create a recordable coverage map of the area that the Fire Department currently covers by mutual agreement.
- Cochran Northwest Stormwater Detention. Cochran brought a plan for a detention basin in the northwest corner of Ste. Genevieve to try and reduce the inflow of water running to the S. Gabouri Creek past Market to South Gabouri Street as part of a stormwater study of the City. After consideration the Board asked them to increase the size of the basin to act as more of a regional detention basin with other groups able to utilize it. Cochran presented the new drawings of the enlarged area along with costs. After discussion the Board would like to have a meeting with Mississippi Lime Company to discuss further options and considerations.
- Maple Street Extension Concrete Alternative. At a previous meeting Alderman Steiger asked if the Maple Street Extension on the North Side of the Early Childhood Education building could be changed from asphalt/concrete curbs to all concrete to become more cost efficient for future expansion. The additional amount to be considered is \$64,000. A voice vote showed four in favor and three against. (Alderman Donovan, Alderman Prince & Alderman Fahey casting the no votes) (Eydmann Absent) This approval will be brought before the board to consider at a future Board of Aldermen meeting.
- False Fire Alarm Policy. Chief Steiger wanted to discuss how current City code now requires that after three false alarm fire department call outs that are not actual fires that the company responsible for the call out will be assessed with the cost going up for each successive trip made

by emergency personnel in a calendar year. Chief Steiger is recommending changing some language in the current ordinance so it is easier to understand.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS. Alderman Steiger recommended that with the existence of the Downtown TIF that the City be more diligent on getting the word out to individuals/business that it exists.

ADJOURNMENT. With no further business Mayor Keim adjourned the work session at 7:52 p.m.



Issue:

We are looking to improve the existing asphalt trail at Pere Marquette Park with a 10 foot wide concrete trail from the big pavilion to the first small pavilion to the east 671 feet. Bids were advertised for the Recreational Trails Program (RTP) project as part of their matching grant program with funds from the Federal Highway Department. Alliance will be doing the demo work tearing out the existing asphalt and the contractor will be adjusting elevations and pouring concrete.

OWNER-CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This is an Agreement made and entered into the 19th day of 1000 day of 1000, 2024, by and between City of Ste. Geneveive (hereinafter called the "Owner") and Kluesner Construction, Inc., a corporation with offices located at PO Box 95, Kelso, MO 63758, (hereinafter called the "Contractor").

The project is identified as Marquette Park Trail Rehabilitation, located in Ste. Genevieve, Missouri, Project No. 23-9542, (hereinafter called "Project")

The Engineer is Cochran, located at 530A East independence Drive, Union, Missouri 63084 (hereinafter called the "Engineer").

WITNESSETH:

The Contractor and the Owner, for the consideration set forth herein, agree es follows:

ARTICLE I

The Contract Documents

The Contract Documents Include the Conditions of the Contract (General Conditions of Owner-Contractor Agreement, Supplementary Conditions and other Conditions), State Wage Determination, Non-Collusion Affidavit, Performance and Payment Bond, Drawings, Specifications, the Construction Schedule, all Addenda issued prior to the execution of this Contract, and all Modifications issued after execution of this Contract, which together with this Agreement form the Contract, and are all as fully a part of the Contract as if attached to this Agreement or repeated herein. All definitions set forth in the General Conditions of Owner-Contractor Agreement are applicable to this Agreement.

The Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties, and supersedes prior negotilations, representations and agreements, whether written or oral. An enumeration of the Contract Documents, other than Modifications, is set forth in Article X,

ARTICLE II

Scope of Work

The Contractor, acting as an independent contractor, shall faithfully and fully perform the Work described in, and shall do everything required by, the Contract Documents or reasonably inferable therefrom, for the complete construction of the project. The Contractor represents and warrants that he has special skills which qualify him to perform the Work in accordance with the Contract and that he is free to perform all such Work and is not a party to any other agreement, written or oral, the performance of which would prevent or interfere with the performance, in whole or in part, of the Work.

Project Narrative: Pere Marquette Park is a 46-acre park that has 3/4 mile of trail starting on Main SL/Little Rock Road and looping through the park connecting soccer fields, disc golf course, bathrooms, pavilions, and playground equipment. The park contains an existing loop trail that has dagraded and is limited in width, The park Master Plan conceives of reconstructing this trail using a solid surface material (concrete) and expanding the width to 10 feet to accommodate walkers/runners side by side and allow bicyclists to use the path. This trail will be engineered and constructed to the required accessibility standards and will help connect future facilities like a new nature area, splash pad, picnic shelter, amphitheater and accessible bathrooms. The existing trail starts and ends on Main St./Little Rock

road with a potential trailhead planned for adjoining property owned by the County of Ste. Genevieve that would provide additional parking.

In 2020, the City of Ste. Genevieve in conjunction with the Parks Advisory Board completed a park use survey of citizens and park patrons. The master plan was then developed using feedback received from the survey which allowed the city to establish cost estimates for full development of the park and establish phases to establish a timeline for park improvements. Based on the results of the survey which stated that nearly 88% of park users participate in walking, hiking and/or running activities the City of Ste. Genevieve decided that trail improvements be included in phase 1. The section of the trail identified in this application will be the first of several phases of trail development for the park. It will connect and provide access to several existing park facilities including 2 park pavilions, a restroom, horseshoe pits, playground, picnic area, basketball court and a parking lot which can be improved to include a trail head. Renovating this section of trail will provide park patrons an example of the positive impact that future improvements can have on their park experience. This trail rehabilitation will start at the Big Pavilion, 800 Matthews Dr., Ste. Genevieve, MO 63670.

ARTICLE III

Time of Completion

- (a) All time limits stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence. The Work to be performed under the Contract shall commence within seven (7) consecutive calendar days of the date of the written Notice to Proceed from the Owner to the Contractor, and shall be completed within 90 consecutive calendar days from and including the date of said written Notice to Proceed, subject to adjustments of this Contract Time as provided in the Contract Documents.
- (b) Contractor shall pay, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, the sum of \$750.00 for each consecutive calendar day after the Final Completion date that the Work has not been completed. The total amount so payable to the Owner as liquidated damages may be deducted from any sums due or to become due to Contractor from Owner.

ARTICLE IV

The Contract Sum and Payments

The Owner agrees to pay, and the Contractor agrees to accept, for the performance of the Contract, the sum of <u>Sixty-Three Thousand</u>, <u>Sixty-Three Dollars and Eighty Cents</u> (\$ 63,063.80), subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents. Based upon proper Applications for Payment submitted by the Contractor to the Owner on or before the twentieth day of the month for Work performed, payment will be made in the form of progress payments as follows and as provided elsewhere in the Contract Documents:

- (1) On or about the tenth day of each following month, ninety-five percent (95%) of the portion of the Contract Sum properly allocable to labor, materials and equipment incorporated into the Work, and ninety-five percent (95%) of the portion of the Contract Sum properly allocable to materials and equipment suitebly stored at the site to be incorporated into the Work, through the period ending up to the twentieth day of the preceding month, less the aggregate of all previous progress payments;
- (2) Final payment within 30 days after the Work is fully completed and accepted by the Owner and the Contract is fully performed.

ARTICLE V

Performance of the Work

- (a) Within 10 days after being awarded the Contract, the Contractor shall prepare and submit for the Owner's approval, (1) a Construction Schedule for the Work in a Gantt Chart format, which Construction Schedule shall indicate the dates for starting and completing the various stages of construction, and (2) a Traffic Control Plan indicating the location of all proposed signage, detours, roed closures throughout the Project which adequately address the Traffic Control Plan of the proposed Work. All traffic control shall be according to the standards of the latest edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices developed by the Federal Highway Administration. No Work will commence until the Contractor's Schedule and Traffic Control Plan is submitted and approved by the Owner.
- (b) Completion of the Work in accordance with the tima limits set forth in the Construction Schedule is an essential condition of the Contract.
- (c) After commencement of the Work, and until final completion of the Work, the Contractor shall report to the Owner at such intervals as the Owner may reasonably direct, the actual progress of the Work compared to the Construction Schedule. If the Contractor falls behind the Construction Schedule for any reason, he shall promptly take, and cause his Subcontractors to take, such action as is necessary to remedy the delay, and shall submit promptly to the Owner for approval a supplementary schedule or progress chart demonstrating the manner in which the delay will be remedied; provided, however, that if the delay is excusable under Article VI hereof, the Contractor will not be required to take, or cause his Subcontractors to take, any action which would increase the overall cost of the Work (whether through overtime premium pay or otherwise), unless the Owner shell have agreed in writing to reimburse the Contractor for such increase in cost. Any increase in cost incurred in remedying a delay which is not excusable under Article VI hereof shall be borne by the Contractor.

ARTICLE VI

Delays Beyond Contractor's Control

- (a) If the Contractor fails to complete the Work in accordance with the Construction Schedule as a result of the act or neglect of the Owner, or by strikes, lockouts, fire or other similar causes beyond the Contractor's control, then, and to the extent of such delays, the Contractor shall not be required to pay liquidated damages to the Owner pursuant to Paragraph (b) of Article III hereof, provided the Contractor uses his best efforts to remedy the delay in the manner specified in Paragraph (c) of Article V hereof. If, as a result of any such cause beyond the Contractor's control, the delay in completion of the Work in eccordance with the Construction Schedule is so great that it cannot be remedied in the aforesaid manner, or if the backlog of work is so great that it cannot be remedied without incurring additional cost which the Owner does not authorize, then the time of completion and the Construction Schedule shall be extended pursuant to a Change Order for the minimum period of delay occasioned by such cause. The period of delay and extension shall be determined by the Owner.
- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing Paragraph (a), no extension of time shall be granted for any delay the cause of which occurs more than seven (7) days before claim therefor is made in writing by the Contractor to the Owner, and no extension of time shall be granted if the Contractor could have avoided the need for such extension by the exercise of reasonable care and foresight. In the case of a continuing cause of delay, only one claim is necessary.
 - (c) Weather shall not constitute a cause for granting an extension of time.

(d) Except to the extent that a delay is caused by the Owner, the Contractor's sole remedy shall consist of his rights under this Article VI.

ARTICLE VII

Changes in the Work

- (a) The Owner may make changes within the general scope of the Contract by altering, adding to or deducting from the Work, the Contract Sum being adjusted accordingly. All such changes in the Work shall be executed under the conditions of the Contract. No extra work or change shall be made except pursuant to a Change Order from the Owner in accordance with the General Conditions. Any claim for an increase in the Contract Sum resulting from any such change in the Work shall be made by the Contractor in accordance with the General Conditions.
- (b) If the requested change would result in a delay in the Construction Schedule, the provisions of Paragraph (c) of Article V and of Article VI hereof shall apply. If the requested change would result in a decrease in the time required to perform the Work, the completion date and the Construction Schedule shall be adjusted by agreement between the parties to reflect such decrease.
- (c) Any adjustment in the Contract Sum for duly authorized extra work or change in the Work shall be determined based on the unit prices previously specified, to the extent such unit prices are applicable. To the extent such unit prices are not applicable, the adjustment in the Contract Sum shall, at the option of the Owner, be determined by an acceptable lump sum properly itemized and supported by sufficient substantiating data to permit evaluation, or by an acceptable cost plus percentage or fixed fee.

ARTICLE VIII

Termination by Owner

(a) If the Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, or if the Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or if a receiver is appointed on account of the Contractor's insolvency, or if the Contractor persistently or repeatedly fails, except in cases for which extension of time is provided, to make progress in accordance with the Construction Schedule, or if the Contractor fails to make prompt payment to Subcontractors for material or labor, or persistently disregards laws, ordinances or the instructions of the Owner, or otherwise breaches any provision of the Contract, the Owner may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy, by giving written notice to the Contractor and his Surety, terminate the Contract, take possession of the Work and of all materials and equipment thereon and finish the Work by whatever method the Owner may deem expedient. In such case, the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any further payment until the Work is finished. If the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum shall exceed the expenses of finishing the Work, including additional architectural, managerial and administrative expenses, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor. If such expenses shall exceed the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the Owner promptly upon demand.

In the event of termination pursuant to this Paragraph, the Contractor, upon the request of the Owner, shall promptly

(i) assign to the Owner in the manner and to the extent directed by the Owner all right, title and interest of the Contractor under any subcontracts, purchase orders and construction equipment leases to which the Contractor is a party and which relate to the Work or to construction equipment required therefor, and

- (ii) make available to the Owner, to the extent directed by the Owner, all construction equipment owned by the Contractor and employed in connection with the Work.
- (b) Performance of the Work hereunder may be terminated by the Owner by giving three (3) days prior written notice to the Contractor if the Owner, in its sole discretion, decides to discontinue or suspend construction. In the event of such termination, as opposed to termination pursuant to Paragraph (a) of this Article VIII, the Contract Sum shall be reduced in an equitable manner by agreement between the parties. The Contractor will not be entitled to payment of profit on work not performed.

ARTICLE IX

Contractor's Liability Insurance

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain in full force and effect the following insurance coverage with an insurance carrier acceptable to the Owner:

The policy shall be endorsed to cover the contractual liability of the Contractor under the General Conditions.

The Contractor and his Subcontractors shall procure and maintain during the life of this Agreement insurance of the types and minimum amounts as follows:

(a) Workers' Compensation in full compliance with statutory requirements of Federal and State of Missouri law and Employers' Liability coverage in the amount of \$2,000,000.

(b) Comprehensive General Liability and Bodily Injury

Including Death: \$2,000,000 each person

\$2,000,000 each occurrence

Property Damage: \$2,000,000 each occurrence

\$2,000,000 aggregate

(c) Comprehensive Automobile Liability, Bodily Injury

Including Death: \$2,000,000 each person

\$2,000,000 each occurrence

Property Damage: \$2,000,000 each accident

(d) Owner's Protective Bodily Injury (Separate Policy)

Including Death: \$2,000,000 each occurrence

Property Damage: \$2,000,000 each occurrence

\$2,000,000 aggregate

The Owner's Protective Policy shall name the Owner as the insured. Certificates evidencing such insurance shall be furnished to the Owner prior to Contractor commencing the Work on this Project. The certificates must state, "City of Ste. Genevieve, the Engineer and their Officers and Employees, are included as an additional insured as required by written contract under the General Liability Policy with respect to work performed by the named insured on the above listed project."
