A Summary of the Board of Education Meeting: June 12, 2024

The open session was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Student Representative Report: The board members watched a video of Blake Bodendieck interviewing students & had them share their plans after high school and their vision of where they see themselves in five years.

Facilities & Infrastructure assessment: The board members approved the district to publish RFP's for Facilities & Infrastructure assessments. At last week's board work session, Hannah White, program manager for Schneider electric, informed the board how an energy and efficiency audit could benefit the district as we consider long-range goals and long range facilities plan. Hannah White explained Schneider's process for site audits to capture savings through efficiency upgrades that can then be reinvested in other facility improvements.

Surplus Equipment:

- Laptops: The board approved for the district to sell obsolete surplus laptops and or chrome books.
- Bus Depreciation: The board voted to table this agenda item until the August 14, 2024.

Policy BDA (Board Meetings) review: The board discussed policy BDA and voted to keep the regular scheduled monthly board meeting's start time at 7:00 p.m. The board meets every second Wednesday of the month.

Welding Rods & Gases Bid: The OzarcGas Company's bid was approved to supply PCSD #32 with welding rods & gases for the 2024-25 school year.

Diesel/ Def fluid & Gasoline: Don Heil Company's bid was approved to supply PCSD #32 with Diesel/ Def fluid & Gasoline for the 2024-25 school year.

Budget Approval:

The board approved the following 2024-2025 budget motions:

- 1) Approved the 2024-2025 budget presented by Dr. Jones.
- 2) Approved to amend the 2023-2024 budget to actual on June 30, 2024 at the conclusion of the fiscal year.
- 3) Approved the transfer from the General Fund to Teachers Fund.
- 4) Approve the transfers of Bus Depreciation, DNR payments, and Career Center Building and Trades costs from General Fund to the Capital Outlay Fund.

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The board reviewed the recommended MSBA Policy updates to Policy: KK (Visitor to district property and events) & Policy JHCD (Administration of medications to students). The updates addressed prohibiting ... the possession, use, distribution, or being under the influence of marijuana on district property or at district activities.

Board member representatives to assist with survey team developments:

Dr. Jones informed the board that the district plans to conduct a focus group session with board member representatives late summer to create a streamlined Climate & Culture Survey, based on the new CSIP. Melissa Carroll and Glendon Sattler volunteered to represent the board on this focus group.

Assessment Update: Jane Narrow, Chief Academic Officer presented spring assessment updates on MAP/EOC testing processes. All buildings reported a smooth and positive implementation of the testing. Primary School's NWEA results were also shared.

Career Center Renovation Presentation: Dan Hecht, Career Center Director, presented the PACTC renovation project. This project is made possible through the Missouri's Area Career Center Opportunity (MACCO) grant, funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The focus areas for the renovations are: 1) Digital Media relocation and renovation 2) Auto Collision paint booth modernization.

Middle School Alternative expansion: The PALS (Perryville Alternative Learning Site) is looking to expand the program offering to PCMS Students. This expansion would provide an opportunity to return to campus, under direct supervision, to continue their academic studies.

Program Evaluations: Stacey Seabaugh, Director of SPED / Title IX Coordinator presented three program evaluations. 1) Gifted Education 2) Homeless 3) ELL/Migrant/Immigrant

The spotlight was a video that showcased the retirees from the 2023-2024 school year.
