The decodable readers help target phonics skills that each individual student can work on during small group instruction. "The goal for this project is to provide texts that will focus on the skills students need to be more accurate and fluent readers," she said. "This particular set of decodable readers follow a scope and sequence that works well with our phonics curriculum; therefore, these books will be a great tool for teaching these littles how to read. They feature a set of characters in which my students can get to know and love across all the books in the set."
 - Mrs. Roemer submitted an application for four different graphic novels for her students in Program English. The graphic novels she requested would enhance the success her students feel with reading, with the hope of carrying over to other classes they attend. Research suggests that graphic novels provide the following benefits:
 - help students develop comprehension, inference, and vocabulary skills as students don't struggle with the format
 - foster comprehension and vocabulary through illustrations
 - improve literacy in reluctant readers due to the visual elements
 - teach students to read with expression
 - use text and pictures to draw conclusions which requires deeper thinking than just reading
 - expose students to many literary devices with images and text
 - allow students of all abilities to read and discuss the same text
 - help students learn about using precise language and punctuation basics

"My goal with providing students with more relatable graphic novels is simple: I would like them to read independently, build comprehension skills, and grow their reading skills through the use of words and pictures," she said. "I want my students to have the opportunity to read high-interest, relatable,

grade level, diverse texts to get them to connect to books." Genevieve High School students led by SGHS industrial technology teacher Kenny Rapp compete in the annual MoDOT Bridge Competition. This year, we are excited to share that out of 28 participating schools, SGHS earned first place for best overall performance. In addition, four SGHS students placed at the event, with two SGHS students taking first and second place overall!

After our students spent weeks figuring out how to build their version of an efficient model bridge, they headed to Southeast Missouri State University's Academic Hall on Nov. 15 to compete. The Missouri Department of Transportation tested more than 200 bridges entered into the competition. The MoDOT Bridge Building Competition challenges high school juniors and seniors to design and construct the most efficient model bridge using limited materials—balsa wood, thread and glue. The lightest bridges that carry the greatest loads are ultimately named the winners. Prize donations were made possible by the following businesses and organizations: SE Chapter Transportation Employee Association of Missouri, Southeast Coalition for Roadway Safety, Bacon Farmer Workman Engineering & Testing, Cape Girardeau Noon Optimist, SE Chapter of Missouri Society of Professional Engineers, and Three Rivers College. MoDOT also partnered with Arkansas State University, University of Missouri-Columbia, Southeast Missouri State University, Missouri University of Science and Technology, and Southern Illinois University to offer seniors interested in civil engineering up to \$10,000 in scholarships. "We are very pleased to have 28 area schools participating in this year's competition," said MoDOT Senior Highway Designer Anita Clark. "In addition to giving students an opportunity to win prizes, our goal is for students to gain an appreciation of STEM careers — specifically engineering." The Missouri State Highway Patrol and the Southeast Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety were on hand during the competition to discuss the importance of buckling up with the Seat Belt Convincer, which simulates how it feels to be in a traffic crash.

 - SGHS STUDENTS HAVE OPPORTUNITY TO HEAR STORY OF HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR April 25, 2024 - Students in the German and History classes at SGHS recently had the opportunity to meet Vera Emmons, whose mother was a young Jewish girl during the Holocaust and survived various concentration camps until her liberation at age 17. Emmons met with the classes virtually, sharing with them the horrors of the Holocaust through the lens of her mother's experiences. Emmons used her mother's own words in past interviews and recordings, photos from her mother's childhood and the war, and additional historical context woven into each phase of her mother's story. Students learned of the stark contrast between their lives today and the life experiences of a girl near their own age leading up to, during and after World War II. Gerda Luner (nee Nothmann) was born in Berlin in 1927. With the passage of laws targeting Jewish people and growing antisemitism, by 12 years of age, Gerda was sent to a foster family in Holland, and she and her sister never saw their parents again. Gerda would lose every member of her family. She found a position with the Philips company, a group that worked to protect Jewish people during the war. Through the entirety of the war, Gerda was moved through six concentration camps as a worker in this company before her liberation from Auschwitz II - Birkenau at the end of the war. Emmons explained how the horrors of the Holocaust and shaped not only her mother's life moving forward in America, but also the lives of the family her mother created and her descendants. Students had the opportunity to ask questions following the presentation, and Emmons explained that the Holocaust is not one of a kind-genocides, xenophobia, and terrorism can be found throughout the world's history and continue today. She shared that the worst of human behavior begins with stereotypes and an "us versus them" mentality, and that it is important for our young people to learn about our darker times in history in order to understand first how they happened and then how to prevent them from happening again. Our students and teachers would like to thank Vera Emmons for her time and for sharing her mother's courageous life story.

Schools Honor Veterans & Service Members - Bailey Otto - January 5, 2024 - The Ste. Genevieve County R-II School District honors veterans, active military and their guests at both the Ste. Genevieve and Bloomsdale campuses in recognition of Veterans Day. Ste.  - Group diversity: Our participants came from a variety of backgrounds, representing different academic disciplines and career aspirations. This diversity has enriched the learning experience and creates a vibrant and inclusive community within the program.
- 2. Working in the community:
 - Successful placements: I am proud of students who have secured employment with local businesses and organizations, which is a testament to our strong partnerships with our community. These appointments span a wide range of industries including finance, healthcare, technology, retail, and more.

 - This year has been incredible for the SBE program at SGHS. Increased student engagement and successful job offers in our community underscore the importance and effectiveness of the program. I would like to thank our hardworking students for making this year such a huge success. I
