 - Thursdays are designated as tutoring time and teachers sign up weekly for students needing to complete work in their class.
 - Friday advisory time is set aside for celebrations and rewards.
- After school Tutoring/Absence Make-up
 - Weekly tutoring sessions occurred after school from 3:15 4:30 pm to allow students to complete late work or make-up days missed.
 - We also held occasional Saturday morning sessions for the same purpose.
- Club days were scheduled this year to allow students to meet with their sponsors. Most clubs met monthly while some met only as needed.
- SGMS operated on a typical seven-period, five day per week schedule .
