The open session was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

The board of directors approved a resolution that adopts the Perry County Multi-Jurisdictional Local Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Jane Narrow, Chief Academic Officer, presented a district assessment update.

Dan Oberkerish, Maintenance Director, gave an update on the "Get the lead out of the drinking water" status.

The attendance report was presented by each building's assistant principal.

- Attendance Goal is 90/90
 - Directly correlates to academic achievement, skill development, and social integration.
 - Enables students to receive consistent instruction, actively engage in classroom activities, and interact with peers.
 - Significantly contribute to their educational growth and overall development.
 - Fosters important life skills: time management, responsibility, and self-discipline.

2023-24 90/90 attendance totals:

High School = 84.01, Middle School = 85.92, Elementary = 91.89, Primary = 88.92

Dr. Jones, Superintendent, presented the board with the Financial and CSIP report. Dr. Jones mentioned that conversations regarding setting measurables for gauging CSIP progress will begin next month.

Dr. Jones explained the district's vision for presenting program evaluations. The evaluations would become available to the board for them to revisit the information often throughout the school year. A question page was added for board members who may want additional clarification about specific program evaluation information. The questions are then communicated in real-time back to the Superintendent.

Dr. Jones reported that the grant for the recording and broadcasting equipment has been submitted and is being reviewed.
