"Form - The Power and Glory of Painting and the Burden of the Earth" by Matthew E. Ziegler was the largest artwork ever exhibited at any of the twenty Promenade des Arts exhibits. It measures 7 feet wide and 5 feet high. Thanks to owner Rick Bayers for sharing it with the art community last autumn.

Matthew Ziegler's Legacy Honored

The central figure in last year's well-attended Promenade des Arts exhibit, bookended by his aunt Sister Cassiana Marie and his niece Dolly Dufour Surkamp, Ziegler's legacy endures as the text on this metal sculpture plaque attests:

A sculptor and visual artist who was instrumental in the establishment and success of the Sainte Genevieve Art Colony during the 1930s.

For four decades, he kept the flame alive, teaching art and being the welcoming presence that encouraged dozens of renowned artists to come here, laying the foundation for Ste. Genevieve as an arts destination.

We also acknowledge all those who make such tributes possible - today's keepers of the flame.
